

If the student...

- Threatens (or reports) a threat to safety of self or others.
- Experiences a medical emergency.
- Presents as depressed, hopeless or anxious.
- Communicates self-harm, self-destructive and/or suicidal thoughts.
- Complains of a physical health concern (minor injury, flu, etc.).
- Reports financial stress.
- Discloses overwhelming family concerns.
- Becomes hospitalized or reports experiencing serious illness.
- Reports academic difficulty due to a physical, psychological or learning disability.
- Communicates a need for disability accommodations.

- Communicates being a victim of sexual assault, stalking, dating violence, domestic violence, sexual exploitation, sexual harassment, sex/gender discrimination, pregnancy discrimination or any related issue.

- Discloses or shows signs of experiencing sexual assault, dating/domestic violence, stalking or sexual harassment.
- Discloses difficulty related to a friend or family member experiencing any of the above issues.

- Struggles academically.
- Routinely misses class, arrives late and/or fails to submit assignments.
- Reports financial concerns.

- Cheats on/plagiarizes assignments.
- Demonstrates disruptive classroom behavior.
- Fails to comply with a campus official.
- Damages university/others' property.

Helping Our Students

MEDICAL ISSUES

Recognize:

- Loss of consciousness.
- Difficulty breathing.
- Sudden pain.
- Seizures.
- Physical injury.

Respond:

- Immediately call for help.
- Do not move an injured person.
- Reassure and calm injured/ill individual.
- Stay with person until help arrives.

Refer:

- If emergency, call 911 or University Police: (859) 572-7777.
- Health, Counseling and Student Wellness: (859) 572-5650.

MENTAL HEALTH ISSUES

Recognize:

- References to suicide or self-destructive behavior.
- Presents as depressed, hopeless or anxious.
- Abnormal behavior or speech.
- Sudden change in behavior, appearance or attendance.

Respond:

- Express concern.
- Avoid criticizing or being judgmental.
- Provide reassurance and encouragement as needed.

Refer:

- If emergency, call 911 or University Police at (859) 572-7777.
- Health, Counseling and Student Wellness: (859) 572-5650.

BEHAVIORAL/SOCIAL ISSUES

Recognize:

- Known illness/injury or recent hospitalization.
- Changes in mood, appearance or behavior.
 - Displays anger/negative emotions inappropriately.
 - Disturbing written material/class behavior.
- Intoxication or drug use.
- Decline in school/social participation.
 - Concern that the student may be missing.
 - Excessive class absences.
- Food or housing insecurity.

WHAT IS THE NKU COMMUNITY CARE TEAM?

The NKU Community Care Team, formerly the Students of Concern Committee, is the behavioral intervention team for Northern Kentucky University and is interdisciplinary in its makeup. The NKU Community Care Team members provide guidance to the Student Conduct Rights and Advocacy (SCRA) staff on reports received related to students experiencing academically or socially disruptive situations and concerns.

MISCONDUCT ISSUES

Recognize

Disruptive Conduct:

- Concerning outbursts.
- Arguing that continues beyond the scope of academic debate.
- Refusing to leave a classroom after being asked to do so.

Bullying or Harassment:

- Behavior that might be threatening or intimidating which places another person in reasonable or actual fear of harm.
- Any form of communication continued after the individual has been told to stop.

Threatening Conduct:

- Intimidation or behavior that incites retaliatory behavior without the time or opportunity for dialogue or response.
- Refusing to let others leave the classroom.
- Throwing items in anger.
- Having a weapon.

Respond

Threatening Conduct:

- In the case of threatening behaviors, immediate action should be taken.
 - Contact University Police: (859) 572-7777 or 911.

Bullying/Harassment/Disruptive Conduct:

- Ask the student to talk to you outside the classroom.
- Express your concern for the student, focusing on the behavior.
- Help student explore options for resolution.

CRIME VICTIMIZATION

Recognize:

- Crying, running out of the classroom and other signs of discomfort when sexual violence, domestic violence, stalking or child abuse is the topic.
- Visible bruise on face, throat, arms or legs.
- Change in demeanor, distracted or shut down.
- Appears to be afraid of another student in the same class.

Respond:

- Listen to and believe what the student tells you.
- Do not ask for details of what happened.
- Do not blame the student.
- Do not pressure the student to report the crime but let them know it is an option.
- Fulfill any reporting duties you have (e.g., Title IX, Clery Act, etc.).
