BEGIN How to Help a Student HERE Are you worried about the student's safety? Do you see possible warning signs? WARNING signs include, but are not limited to: Talks about/threatens suicide* Marked change in academic performance Crying or other visible signs of distress Talks about hurting/killing others* Marked change in behavior and or mood Withdrawal from others (isolation) Engaging in self-harm (e.g., cutting)* Nervousness, agitation or aggression Signs of alcohol and/or drug use YES NO Directly ask about your concern and/or the warning signs * Directly ask about suicide/homicide as it relates to the displayed warning sign Do you believe the student is in imminent danger? **DO NOT LEAVE THE STUDENT ALONE** VFS UNCLEAR NO Examples: Examples: Examples: Student disoriented, found unconscious or Student reports a history of self-injurious Student reports anxiety and depression, but unresponsive. behaviors (i.e. cutting or burning) and now denies suicidal/homicidal thoughts and shows states a desire to engage in the behavior again. no warning signs. Student tells you that they have ingested pills beyond the recommended dose (whether Student appears intoxicated or under the Student is upset/grieving but denies suicidal/ student confirms it is a suicide attempt or not). influence of substances. homicidal thoughts and shows no warning signs. Student is threatening immediate danger to Student makes statements that are suggestive As much as you and the student are self (i.e. threatening to jump out a window, of suicidal/homicidal thinking that are not comfortable, listen and provide support; but do ingest pills, shoot self, etc.). overtly indicative of imminent danger (i.e. "I don't know if I can keep going."). not act as the student's therapist. Student attempts, or threatens to cause physical harm to someone else or people in general.
