Notes:

1. This report is based on employee data as reported to the US Department of Education through the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS). The information shown is from a “snapshot” of persons on the university’s payroll as of November 1 of the year indicated.
2. The data for 2008 are adjusted from the figures originally reported to IPEDS.
3. The full-time employee data for 2009 required no adjustments to IPEDS. These are the originally reported figures.
4. In accordance with IPEDS reporting, the data for 2012 and moving forward reflect revised SOC codes for staff. The new staff categories are occupational categories that group some of the SOC codes. Here, “Other” includes Librarians, Curators, Archivists, and Other Teaching Instructional Support; Service Occupations; Sales and Related Occupations; Natural Resources, Construction, and Maintenance; Office and Administrative Support; Production, Transportation, and Material Moving; Academic Affairs and Other Education Services.
5. IPEDS allows institutions to report department chairs and other faculty with administrative or other non-instructional duties as either faculty or administrative staff. NKU has historically reported academic chairs, faculty advisors, and academic program directors as non-instructional staff on the IPEDS report. These individuals have faculty appointments at NKU and are now being reported as faculty on other internal documents. Therefore, NKU is reporting these individuals as faculty for the 2014 IPEDS report and forward.
6. Per IPEDS instructions, certain groups of employees are excluded from the report. These groups include temporary employees, work study students, and volunteers.
