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



DATA SPOTLIGHT: UPDATE ON SBD METRICS




Our singular focus on student success as laid out in the current strategic plan, <u>Success by Design</u>, has continued to generate positive gains in several student achievement areas. Our dedication to impacting the lives of all students is reflected in the latest data and through the impactful work of numerous university initiatives.

Targeted strategies implemented through the <u>Moon Shot for Social and Economic Mobility</u> and other initiatives have been especially impactful on our first-generation and low-income student populations. By working to improve process efficiencies and remove barriers such as registration holds, we have seen continuous improvement in the areas of retention, graduation, and time-to-degree.







While we are still working diligently to build up our total undergraduate enrollment, we have seen dramatic success with our transfer student population, with enrollments increasing by more than 30% in each semester since the launch of the <u>Adult and Transfer Center</u> (ATC). This rapid growth in transfer student enrollment and retention can be attributed to focused efforts on credit articulation, clear transfer pathways, and enhanced advising which have provided a more seamless transition for incoming students. In recognition of their work, the ATC team has been awarded CPE's *Transformational Leadership Award* for improving the transfer experience from Gateway to NKU.


NKU's unwavering commitment to student success is yielding measurable outcomes, which we intend to continue with the launch of our next strategic plan this coming Fall.

Introducing the Multi-Year Degrees and Certificates Dashboard

Planning and Institutional Research has rolled out another dashboard in Power BI: The Multi-Year Degrees and Certificates Awarded Dashboard. Similar to the style of the Multi-Year Enrollment Dashboard launched last year, we have provided in the Multi-Year Degrees and Certificates Dashboard master filters and trend breakouts of key student populations. Interactive tables include drill up and drill down capability across multiple dimensions. Features include the ability to save and export custom-built tables for your presentations.




New! Multi-Year Dashboard Training: April 22
