**MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING
OF THE BOARD OF REGENTS
OF NORTHERN KENTUCKY UNIVERSITY
Wednesday, February 26, 2025**

In Open Session

Call to Order: Regent Nathan Smith, Chair, called the regular meeting of the Board of Regents to order at 9:00 AM on Wednesday, February 26, 2025. He then requested that Tammy Knochelmann, Secretary to the Board of Regents, call the roll.

Roll Call: The following members of the Board were present. Lucy Burns, Shea Conley, Cori Henderson, Ashley Himes, Nathan Smith, Sandra Spataro, André Ward, Brad Zapp.

Ms. Knochelmann confirmed that a quorum was present.

Approval of Minutes:

Regent Henderson seconded Regent Ward's motion to approve the minutes from the Board of Regents meeting held on November 12, 2024. (*Motion carried*)

Regent Spataro seconded Regent Ward's motion to approve the minutes from the Special Board of Regents meeting held on January 15, 2025. (*Motion carried*)

Committee Meeting Summaries:

Regent Nathan Smith, Chair of the Audit Risk and Finance Committee and the Executive Committee, summarized the meetings held on February 25, 2025.

Regent Brad Zapp, Chair of the Budget and Finance Committee, summarized the February 20, 2025 committee meeting.

Regent Ashley Himes, Chair of the Student Success and Academic Affairs Committee, summarized the meetings held on February 10, 2025, and February 25, 2025.

President's Report:

Good morning. I am pleased to be here with all of you to share updates about our progress toward our priorities together in enrollments, finances, modernization, regional engagement, and campus culture.

First, and most importantly, I am pleased to report that our strategic enrollment management planning and execution efforts are paying dividends. As was the case in the fall, our enrollments are up across the board this spring—up in undergraduate, graduate, law. You'll learn more about the details from our new Chief Strategic Enrollment Management Officer Ryan Padgett shortly. And we are all working hard to strengthen our enrollments for fall—through the direct admit process, 3 states/1 rate tuition model, improved regional school relationships, increased partnerships, Slate integration, and more. We are optimistic about our enhanced community college pipelines, our campaigns to grow our adult learner populations, our growing ROTC program, and much more!

And you'll hear from CFO Chris Calvert shortly too. We are making major progress toward balancing our budget and strengthening our finances. We have made enormous progress and while more remains, I'm optimistic and appreciate the hard work and restraint of so many of you to reach this point. It feels good to position ourselves for 3% raises, roll back the CRC fees for faculty and staff, plan for future budget years where raises are budgetary assumptions, and have the opportunity to explore new benefits with all of you. These are fun conversations to have—opportunities and explorations discussed in open

town hall forum events feel a world away from the years of cutting. I so appreciate your willingness to think out loud with me and email me your ideas and questions. I lead best when colleagues can ask questions and share ideas openly and with trust and confidence. Thank you to the dozens of people who have reached out to me; while I can't pursue each idea or solution, your perspectives make my leadership fuller and better.

Speaking of better, our new website and ERP projects have begun, and we are about to become so much better as an institution. With these two projects, we will dramatically improve our front door and the entire organization's operations.

It is hard to convey just how much Workday will modernize this campus's daily operations for employees and students. And as we begin the three-year migration from SAP to Workday, it is important that we understand that we will change our norms and practices. Just as we have had to adapt in Slate from 5 application processes to one, we will need to change to become more efficient and streamlined. It's not easy but it will be necessary to thrive in the future. We will all adapt to higher education and operational best practices. In other words, we will not replicate everything we do today in the same way we currently do them, unless our current way is a best practice.

And we will find many benefits in our new system. For example, Workday will modernize the student experience with faster delivery of tasks, a centralized inbox, and enhanced mobile capabilities. Students will love how easy and understandable NKU processes will become. In addition, we will all benefit from dramatically improved analytics and reporting with an intuitive interface for self-service that will result in more readily available, valuable information at our fingertips. We will standardize and streamline the automation of processes across campus to create a more efficient NKU. For example, onboarding new employees will become more efficient and a better experience based on standardization of forms and other activities. We will eliminate TalentED and HR performance evaluation software, and instead utilize Workday functionality. That means that we will have new performance review tools and processes to learn and use, making it easier to manage and deploy merit raises, starting next year.

Utilizing higher education best practices will reduce time, money, and risk, make compliance easier, and provide more efficient upgrades while making data more easily accessible to all of campus. For example, we will have one payroll cycle as it will lower costs and decrease duplication of work. We will use supply catalogs for procurement, which will lower NKU prices, maximize rebates, and decrease the number of purchase cards on campus.

With Workday, the need for multiple products and systems decreases, allowing the campus to reduce training needs and focus more on student, faculty, and staff experiences. Put simply, we can reduce the manual, the mundane, and the monotonous.

And we will be better equipped to analyze and improve. We will have one version of data that is available for reporting and analytics. We will be significantly advantaged by having point in time data across the enterprise. We will also eliminate PBCS budget software, again utilizing Workday functionality. This list of efficiencies could go on and on.

I predict that three years from now, the efficiency and effectiveness of our collective work will significantly improve our university's work and enhance morale. All of my presidential priorities are intended to make NKU healthier—financially, technologically, operationally, strategically, and culturally. As we work to improve the health of the university, so too must we continue to work on strengthening our people. Higher education is people-centric work and we will work to strengthen our institution with our people in mind in our next three-year strategic plan. This plan is drafted and being reviewed across campus and its focus is on three segments of people—our students, our colleagues, and the people of our region's community. Please help us to get this plan just right.

Next, let me share some of the work we've done to engage our region, something that NKU is uniquely good at doing. All academic year, I have worked hard to engage with our regional partners on numerous

fronts. Ryan Padgett, Mike Borchers, and I have extended ourselves to countless meetings with our superintendent, principals, and high school counselors in the region. We are surrounded by excellent, committed school districts who care about their students' educations and futures. We are working to strengthen our ties to our regional feeder schools, ensuring that we are working well with them and partnering wherever possible.

I am also working to better align with corporate and nonprofit partners, ensuring that our students are ready to enter our region's workforce. We are preparing to launch the new Norse Network Hub—the executive director search is underway, and we look forward to creating our hub and spoke system to meet the talent imperative of our time. To that end, I have been heavily engaged in many boards in the region—to listen and learn how NKU can best serve our region's needs. We are strong stewards of place, and we will grow even stronger.

We have also been engaged in relationships with our legislative caucus and advocacy. It's been an unusually active period for higher education in Washington, DC, and in Frankfort. Already this year – that's not even two months' time – we've seen dozens of proposals that would impact higher education. Here are the kind of numbers we're managing: approximately 1,100 bills filed in the Kentucky legislature; more than 100 executive orders and other requirements issued by the White House, the US Department of Education, and other federal agencies; and at least 88 separate lawsuits around the country that challenge some of those proposals, plus court orders coming out, almost on a weekly basis, that can change our approach to these issues.

I want to thank Eric Gentry, Jenny Sand, and Grant Garber in particular and the cabinet in general for all of the ways they've devoted themselves to this important work.

These proposals would affect nearly every aspect of our operations and campus life – and most of them have the potential to challenge us.

I'd like to talk about one set of proposals in particular – those related to diversity, equity, and inclusion efforts in higher education. And I'd like to share what those may mean – and not mean – for NKU.

In Frankfort, the legislature is currently, carefully considering House Bill 4. This proposal would curtail a variety of DEI activities on university campuses in Kentucky.

First, I offer a silver lining: the proposal includes broad protections for academic freedom, course content, research, activities of student organizations, and First Amendment rights. We expect that the state legislature will protect our teaching and research activities – the very essence of what we do – even when they involve instruction or research into areas related to diverse cultures and peoples and histories.

The legislature should protect those things. If it does, NKU will too.

The bill also prohibits many DEI activities, including certain kinds of training and the use of race-based distinctions to provide benefits and resources. At this point, House Bill 4 is a proposal. It still must complete the legislative process, and it's difficult to predict exactly how that will go. We are also aware of guidance earlier this month from the U.S. Department of Education, which also prohibits many DEI-related activities and promises quick enforcement. We're closely following all of that.

But in the meantime, let me share a few things that I know about NKU and about how we, together, will respond.

First, we will not make changes to our current operations and programs based on speculation. We will not be guided only by worst-case scenarios. But NKU will follow the law—we will follow the clear legal requirements that apply to us.

And although our campus does not have a DEI office, we probably will be required to make other changes. Several months ago, we began a conversation with many campus leaders about how NKU

could adapt and reimagine the work we do in light of these kinds of proposals. In the coming days and weeks, those conversations will reach a conclusion, and I will communicate the outcomes to all of you.

And hear me when I say: We will get through this moment together. NKU is strong, but we will be stronger and more vibrant and more welcoming tomorrow than we are today. There is not one way to deliver positive outcomes for all of our students.

Yet, every day, there are so many moments of light and goodness that happen on our campus – the moment of inspiration in a classroom or discovery in a laboratory or a library, the quiet victory after a mid-term, the not so quiet victories in a basketball arena or on a softball field, the helping hand or the familiar face when we encounter a difficult problem, the new connection between people from different walks of life who could have only met in a place like NKU.

Every day, we change lives, a little bit at a time; but my goodness, every little change is worthwhile and cumulatively, we see major trajectories in our remarkable students. Those trajectories, the life change we uniquely deliver will never change. Period. Full stop.

I am reminded of the words of Katica Roy, who wrote, “Progress is not linear. And equity, once advanced, is never guaranteed.” The best response to all that faces us, in this moment, is this: We will carry on the mission of excellent higher education in this region – with purpose, grace, and good care.

I ask each of you to join me in that important work. I ask each of you to continue to do your work to the very best of your ability, not excessively doom scroll or dwell in the headlines that we often cannot control. I ask each of you to meet your colleagues with empathy and understanding, not with hostility. I ask each of you to meet each day with courage and optimism, not fear or hate.

Finally, I want to say something to our students, especially those who feel most disheartened by what’s happening. I think about you day and night—ask Steve, he knows. Put simply, I lead with you in mind. I know that the time you’re living through is painful. I see it. I know it. I hear you. I hear your frustration, your despair and anger, as well as your resolve.

And I want you to know that there is a place for each of you—every single one of you—on this campus. Regardless of who passes what bill – you belong here. We will have meaningful and impactful programs, spaces, and people here for you. Your success is our purpose and joy and every single person who works on this campus is committed to your success. We will build an even better NKU with you and our students, at the very forefront of our minds.

As we move forward, I want to usher in some new norms. One of the new norms is a bimonthly presidential town hall forum for our colleagues—where half of the time is yours to speak, ask questions, and share concerns. Our next town hall is scheduled for April 8 at 9 am in this room.

Another new norm is to conclude this president’s report with a brief video, what I’ll call a mission moment. Today’s mission moment is focused upon our University Connect and Persist (UCAP) program, a department where students can meet one-on-one with knowledgeable staff to navigate financial, academic, and personal topics. Under the supervision of the amazing Peg Adams who has served NKU for approximately 40 years, we also feature two independently run programs operating as stand-alone departments—FUEL NKU and Care Closet @ NKU, led by Nick, Caitlin, and Reese, respectively.

In these departments, thousands of students are nurtured through your referrals, and the devoted staff in these offices serve our students beyond the classroom, helping them defy the odds that are often against them as they work to walk across that stage at commencement. Our wraparound supports lead to student success in the classroom and their futures beyond it. I am so proud of each of you and offer you my gratitude for your outstanding work.

University Reports:

Ryan Padgett, Chief Strategic Enrollment Officer, provided an update on Spring 2025 enrollment.

Highlights included:

- Total enrollment increased by 2.1% year-over-year, reaching 14,830 students.
- Undergraduate enrollment increased by 2.2%, while graduate enrollment rose by 2.1%.
- New student enrollment increased, particularly in freshmen (+14) and undergraduate transfers (+75).
- Undergraduate first-year retention improved, but overall persistence remained flat.

Chris Calvert, Vice President of Administration & Finance and Chief Financial Officer, provided updates on FY25 Budget and Forecast, FY26 Budget, Five-Year Pro Forma, and University Housing.

Financial Report and Forecast

Highlights included:

- Net tuition revenue (NTR) increased by \$4.82M due primarily to improved enrollment and scholarship adjustments.
- Spring 2025 NTR was \$2.6M higher than Spring 2024.
- Projected FY25 deficit forecast is \$2.77M, an improvement from the \$4.80M budgeted deficit.

FY26 Budget & Five-Year Pro Forma

Highlights included:

- Plans to restore fiscal stability through a balanced budget and positive cash flow.
- Key draft assumptions:
 - Net tuition revenue increase of \$6.1M.
 - 3% salary increase estimated at \$3.3M.
 - 2.5% tuition increase (TBD).
 - State appropriations increase of \$487K.
- Projected FY26 deficit: \$907K, improving from previous years.
- FY26 Budget Assumptions are pending state decisions on tuition and performance funding.

Housing & Student Services

Highlights included:

- Student housing occupancy correlates to in-person undergraduate enrollment.
- Housing debt: Total outstanding \$52.2M, with different maturity dates from 2027 to 2044.
- Upcoming initiatives:
 - First-year students assigned to Boothe Village.
 - Graduate students and staff eligible for Northern Terrace housing.
 - Facility upgrades planned, including kitchen improvements and updated policies.

B-2) Research/Grants/Contracts Report (September 1, 2024 through November 30, 2024 for Fiscal Year 2024-2025: (Provost and Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs Diana McGill).

During the September 1, 2024 through November 30 time period, **22** grants were awarded. The total amount of money awarded was **\$5,480,369**. For the fiscal year 2024-25, the cumulative total number of grants awarded is **47** totaling **\$11,866,816**.

ACADEMIC AFFAIRS

The College of Arts and Sciences changed the name for the “Integrative Studies” organizational unit to “Interdisciplinary Studies”. Name change approved through UCC and implemented in 2024-2025 Catalog. This change reflects a change in the program curriculum and updated name of majors (BA and AA).

UNIVERSITY ADVANCEMENT

University Advancement is creating the Norse Network Hub as a one-stop point of entry. The goal of the Norse Network Hub is to leverage the resources and talents of our students, faculty, and staff to make a positive, significant, and lasting impact on our region. To facilitate this action the Career Services department will move from Strategic Enrollment Planning in the Academic Affairs Division to the new Norse Network Hub organizational unit reporting to the new Executive Director.

STRATEGIC ENROLLMENT MANAGEMENT

President Short-Thompson created the Strategic Enrollment Planning and Student Success division, led by Ryan Padgett, who was promoted to Chief Strategic Enrollment Management Officer (CSEMO). University Undergraduate Admissions was added to Dr. Padgett’s portfolio of direct reports.

FINANCIAL AID

Leah Stewart’s title was changed from Assistant Vice President of Enrollment Management to Assistant Vice President of Financial Aid and Operations. She will continue to lead the One Stop Center and Student Financial Aid.

C-14) Science Center Expansion

The Board of Regents authorized the administration to increase the scope of the capital project listed below, pursuant to the Board Finance and Transactions Approval policy.

- **Science Center Renovations.** In June 2024, the Board approved an investment of \$6,000,000 in AP funds for various renovations and capital renewal of mechanical, electrical and plumbing equipment in the existing Science Center. Completion of the capital renewal work in Science while the construction manager is in place and other renovations are underway is in the best interest of the university. We have capacity in the AP pool to address these issues. Approval is requested to increase the AP scope, using AP funds, to \$8,000,000 to address additional capital renewal issues which have been identified.

C-15) Arena Contract Expansion

The Board of Regents authorized the administration to extend its agreement with SMG (dba ASM Global) regarding the management of Truist Arena. ASM Global was the only management company that responded to a 2023 RFP for the arena’s management.

FACILITIES MANAGEMENT REPORT

1. Herrmann Science Center Expansion

The Herrmann Science Expansion project will provide additional teaching and research labs for biology, chemistry, biochemistry, physics, geology and engineering technology (EGT) in an 83,175 square foot addition on the north side of the 175,131 square foot Dorothy Westerman Herrmann Science Center. CINSAM and Kentucky Center for Mathematics will relocate to Science from Landrum. The addition will feature new labs for EGT, an anatomy and physiology lab suite, aquatics research space, geology labs and ample student engagement space. About 15,000 square feet in the existing building will be renovated. Classrooms will be reconfigured for active learning and new research space will be created for biology, chemistry and physics.

The addition is three levels with a rooftop penthouse (the existing building is four levels with a rooftop penthouse) and a structural steel frame and drilled piers. It will connect to the existing building at each floor and features a glass and metal panel façade.

To help with the significant cost of capital renewal in the Herrmann Science Center, which is part of the overall Science project, \$8M in 2022-2024 Asset Preservation funds will be used to replace air handlers and the atrium smoke exhaust fans, restore lab exhaust fans, and replace other key Science infrastructure in need of life cycle replacement.

All bidding is now complete. Underground utility work and installation of concrete piers and foundations are underway. To facilitate underground electrical installation, a campus-wide electrical shutdown began at noon on Thursday May 22nd and extended through May 26th, the Memorial Day holiday.

2. **Landrum Academic Center Renovation**

This project will include a full life-cycle renovation of Landrum Academic Center, home to the departments of English; History; Sociology, Anthropology & Philosophy; IT's Media Services unit; and the Arts & Sciences Advising Center. The KY Center for Mathematics and CINSAM, currently housed in Landrum, will relocate to the Science Center expansion wing in summer 2027.

The design team has been selected, and a steering committee of department chairs and faculty is helping lead the visioning, programming and design processes. The renovation will result in spaces that facilitate interdisciplinary teaching and learning; support the well-being of users; create a more welcoming aesthetic; introduce more daylight into the spaces; and aid in the recruitment and retention of faculty and students.

The programming and classroom analysis process is underway. This effort reconciles programmatic need with available space and budget. Also, during the summer months, the design team will complete various due diligence efforts related to condition of building systems and infrastructure. Schematic Design will begin upon completion of the programming phase.

3. **Commonwealth Center for Biomedical Excellence**

The 2024 General Assembly provided funding to the Northern Kentucky Port Authority to lead development of the Commonwealth Center for Biomedical Excellence (CCBE), with the goal to relocate Chase College of Law and the UK College of Medicine's Northern Kentucky campus from NKU's Highland Heights campus to the Covington riverfront.

HDR was retained by the Port Authority to serve as owner's project architect. The programming process is underway and will be followed by schematic design, site analysis and further planning studies. The current schedule anticipates initiation by the Port Authority of a process to select a design build contractor to complete design and coordinate construction of the building.

4. **Fine Arts Floor Heaving/Corbett & HVAC (AP)**

This Asset Preservation project includes demolition and reconstruction of 13,000 square feet of heaved floor slab on the first floor of the Fine Arts Center; installation of a new fire alarm system; replacement of finishes in Corbett Theatre; and, total replacement of the building’s HVAC system. In addition, the stage rigging system, damaged by the heaved floor, was replaced.

Fine Arts third and fourth floors re-opened at the start of the fall semester 2024 with a new HVAC system. The refurbished Corbett theatre and reconstructed Corbett stage and scene shop, and the remainder of instructional spaces on the first floor with the exception of the instructional print lab and Stauss Theatre, opened in late November. The Print Lab and Stauss Theatre will reopen in August.

The final phase of HVAC replacement work in Fine Arts is underway this summer on the 2nd floor, on the “new” Fine Arts side of the 3rd floor and in Greaves Concert Hall. An August 2025 completion is anticipated.



5. **Nunn Hall Floor Heaving/Restrooms and HVAC Renewal (AP)**

This Asset Preservation project includes demolition and reconstruction of 11,300 square feet of heaved floor slab on the first floor of Nunn Hall. The scope also includes replacement of restrooms on all five floors, a new fire alarm system and upgrades to the HVAC system.

Chase completed a successful fundraising effort to relocate the moot courtroom from the 4th floor to the 1st floor of Nunn Hall. The courtroom will be named the Chase College Foundation Courtroom. Work is being managed as a change order to the Nunn Hall floor heaving project. The project includes seating for 100, a built-in judges' bench, jury box, judges' chambers and jury deliberation room, and will include a mix of wood finishes with full audiovisual support systems.

Renovation work on the first floor of Nunn Hall is progressing well. The contractor is adding finishes to the 1st floor areas as the project moves toward an August 2025 completion.



6. **Fine Arts Freight Elevator Modernization (AP)**

Electrical and mechanical components in the Fine Arts freight elevator are worn and misaligned, affecting reliability and consistency of performance. Currently, this elevator is non-functional and modernization is essential. Murphy Elevator started work on site. Completion is expected in winter 2025-2026.

7. **Kentucky Hall Transformer and Water Heater (AP)**

Replacement of Kentucky Hall’s main pad-mounted electrical transformer and water heater are critical needs due to poor condition and signs of failure. The water heater was installed by Schmidt Plumbing in August 2023. The transformer replacement has been awarded to SECO. Notification of a ship-date for the transformer has not yet been received.

8. **Campbell Hall Return Air System Upgrade (AP)**

The return air system in Campbell Hall is in poor condition. New equipment will ensure proper airflow, enhance indoor air quality and improve occupant comfort. New VAV boxes have been installed throughout the building and control system upgrades are underway. Project completion is pending, waiting on air balancing. A summer 2025 completion is expected.

9. **Student Union Roof Restoration (AP)**

The Student Union roof is at the end of its life. The installation contract was awarded to WTI-Tremco. Restoration work began in April and should be completed by the middle of August.

10. **Concrete Sidewalk/Plaza Repairs (AP)**

Phases one and two are complete. The third phase, which is now complete, included repairs to various concrete stairs, curbs and sidewalks. An additional phase is planned.

The first phase of the project included replacement of ten isolation valves. A second phase to replace additional valves began in fall 2024, to be complete in summer 2025.



16. **Replace Road and Sidewalk Lighting (AP)**

This project includes replacement of end-of-life sidewalk and roadway lighting and is a follow-up to a phased campus improvement project. A number of roadway and parking lot light poles are safety concerns due to poor condition. The poles to be replaced in this phase are located near Campbell Hall, in Boothe Village, near Mathematics-Education-Psychology Center, and in various parking lots. Installation of poles continues.

Because the pole replacement bid below budget, remaining project funding will be used to replace the poor condition light bollards along the sidewalk between Mathematics-Education-Psychology Center and Business Academic Center. Bluegrass Electric was low bidder for this work. Work on bollards will begin summer 2025.

18. **Albright Health Center Hot Water System Replacement (AP)**

The existing domestic hot water system in the Health Center, which connects to the geothermal system, has proven to be unreliable and is frequently out of service. With this project, gas-fired boilers will be installed to produce hot water independent of the geothermal system. The new system, a more traditional design compared to the geothermal system, will provide redundancy for a variety of domestic water uses in this building. This phase of the project is complete.

In addition, this project includes the replacement of the hot tub boiler, which was also connected to the geothermal system. This new boiler will function as a backup to the pool heating boiler, which does not currently have a redundant system in place. The project was awarded to Debra Kuempel. The boiler has been ordered but the delivery date has not yet been scheduled. Preliminary on-site work has started.

The report and project budget are under review. Once the scope of work is confirmed, design will begin.

This project includes structural restoration, based on the 2021 structural condition assessment, of the cast-in-place, post-tensioned Welcome Center Parking Garage. Work includes application of water repellent to all parking decks and ramps; repairs to isolation joints and pour strips; and elimination of freeze/thaw damage to the concrete and steel railing system embedded in the top of the façade panels. Bids for this project opened in late April and work is underway. Work is being phased to allow parts of the garage to remain open at all times. A fall 2025 completion is anticipated.

22. **Civic Center Renovation (AP)**

Design is being managed with close involvement of Justice Cabinet staff, the Kentucky State Police and the State Medical Examiner.

23. Ceramics Building Façade Restoration (AP)

Ceramics has a concrete block and EIFS ("Dryvit") façade. The block is taking on water and some blocks are cracked, the EIFS has deteriorated on the weather sides of the building and needs coating/restoration. The steel supporting the large kiln pad roof needs to be treated and painted. Numerous windows need gasket and thermal break restoration. Work began in May and will be completed in August.

This system is monitored by University Police 24x7, is 'smart' and is the latest technology for ensuring life safety. Bidding is complete, and work will begin this summer in a phased building-by-building installation plan.

26. Administrative Center Plumbing Infrastructure (AP)

The restrooms will be reconstructed within the current footprint. A new single-person restroom will be added to the second and third floors, and a mothers' room will be added to the third floor. The project is in the construction documents phase. Construction is anticipated to begin in December 2025 with completion about a year later.

CMTA Energy Solutions will serve as designer and general contractor under the Kentucky Educational Development Corporation cooperative purchasing agreement. CMTA will competitively bid the work following state procurement law.

The HVAC work is in the design phase. Replacement of the Regents HVAC system will begin in November and be completed in January 2026. Bidding for the lighting replacement was completed in April and the new lighting will be installed in July.

31. **Tennis Court Reconstruction**

The new courts will be constructed on a structured concrete reinforced concrete slab designed to prevent cracking. This project is currently in schematic design. If funding permits, two to four pickleball courts will be constructed elsewhere on campus. Design is expected to be completed in early fall 2025 with bidding and construction to follow.

VACATION/ANNUAL LEAVE

A revision to this policy was approved so that individuals who separate from employment in good standing and later return to work at the University may accrue vacation hours based on total years of University service, without resetting the accrual clock to the more recent re-hire date.

Northern Kentucky University

Department of Intercollegiate Athletics 2024-25 Report

The mission of NKU Athletics is to advance the University's vision while focusing on the well-being of our student-athletes as we prepare and empower each of them for academic and competitive success at NKU and beyond. We are committed to serving and engaging the University and local community while preserving and establishing meaningful and enduring relationships with alumni, friends and fans.

Academic Excellence

Meeting one of the three benchmarks below is required to earn the NCAA academic based revenue distribution. For 2024-25, NKU Athletics met all of the three benchmarks and will receive an NCAA distribution in Summer 2025.

- Graduation success rate (GSR) holds institutions accountable for student-athletes who transfer to their school. GSR does not penalize institutions for student-athletes that leave the institution in good academic standing and eligible.
Benchmark of GSR (2017-18) at or above 90% was met. NKU Athletics had a GSR of 98%. This is the highest rate ever for NKU.
- Federal graduation rate (FGR) accounts for first-year, full-time student-athletes who entered an institution on athletics aid and graduated from that institution within six years.
Benchmark of FGR (2017-18 cohort) at 13 percentage points or more above the general student body was met. NKU student-athlete FGR exceeded the general student body by 28% for the cohort (student-athlete FGR 78%, general student body FGR 50%).
- Academic progress rate (APR) is the measure of student-athletes remaining academically eligible and NKU retaining them term to term.
Benchmark of APR (2023-24) of 985 or better was met. NKU Athletics had an APR of 994.

NKU Athletics aims to achieve a student-athlete GPA that is at or above a 3.2 and higher than the undergraduate student body each semester. For the Fall 2024 semester, NKU student-athletes achieved a 3.359 department GPA that was above the undergraduate student body GPA of 3.11.

18 of 19 teams earned above a 3.04 GPA. Forty-four student-athletes achieved a perfect 4.0 GPA and 262 student-athletes earned a GPA of 3.0 or higher (over 81%).

Highest team GPA:

- Women's Basketball = 3.696

Spring 2025 semester GPA was not final as of the day of submitting this report.

In addition to monitoring GPA and graduation rates, Athletics collaborated with university partners and encouraged student-athletes to attend events that provide life skills programming and prepare students for careers after college. Community and Alumni Engagement

Sports programs recorded 3,551 hours of community service with participation coming from baseball, men’s basketball, women’s basketball, cheerleading, men’s cross country/track & field, women’s cross country/track & field, dance, men’s golf, women’s golf, men’s soccer, women’s soccer, softball, stunt, men’s triathlon, women’s triathlon, and women’s volleyball.

NKU Athletics hosted events that engaged with former student-athletes, donors and fans. Those events included:

- Hoops & Scoops on October 3, 2024
- Head Coaches & AD Dinner on November 13, 2024
- David Lee Holt Athletics Hall of Fame induction ceremony on January 11, 2025
- The student-athlete alumni reunion took place in conjunction with the women’s and men’s basketball double header on January 11, 2025. During those games, NKU former coach and longtime athletics director, Jane Meier, was honored with the hanging of a banner in Truist Arena. Athletics also celebrated the 2000 National Championship women’s basketball team at the games.

NCAA Compliance

NKU self-reported three violations involving three different sports. The violations submitted to the NCAA were considered minor.

In the sport of baseball, a new assistant coach was involved in a countable athletically related activity with a student-athlete prior to the academic year. The NCAA penalty included institutional rules education and reduction in athletic activity for the involved student-athlete.

In the sport of women's track, a transfer student-athlete participated in practices activities prior to completing all NCAA forms. The NCAA penalty included institutional rules education.

In the sport of softball, a prospective student-athlete took an official visit without being placed on the institution's IRL – a NCAA requirement. The NCAA penalty included institutional rules education for the coaching staff.

Revenue Generation

Revenue from home tournaments increased by \$8,555.00 due to the addition of a women's golf tournament in Florida this year. The women's program plans to continue hosting the tournament and may consider adding a similar event for the men's golf program in the future.

Overall, revenue from sport ticket sales increased by \$12,619.14 compared to the previous year. We expect continued growth, driven by the addition of women's stunt and men's volleyball programs. The women's stunt team is planning its first home competition, while the men's volleyball team will compete in its inaugural season in FY26.

Please note, revenue generation will continue to be a main priority for Athletics in FY26. Our staff are diligently working to identify new revenue streams, enhance existing programs and events, and leverage strategic partnerships to drive growth.





OUTDOOR TRACK AND FIELD

In the 2024 outdoor season, Erin Starks had an incredible performance at the Tennessee Invite, breaking NKU's 100m hurdles record twice in the same meet, grabbing a fifth-place finish with a time of 13.76.

Julia Pohl continued her great season at the meet, claiming fifth in the high jump.

At the Inaugural Norse Track & Field Invitational, plenty of Norse set personal bests, including Julia Pohl, Meredith Goff, Cameron Bitterman, Summit Northrup, and Sophia DeLiso, while plenty of others recorded standout performances as well.



Outdoor Championship


At the Horizon League Outdoor Track & Field Championships, NKU sent 16 athletes across 21 entries to the final day to compete for a gold medal.

In the women's 200m race, NKU took the top two spots as Erin Starks and Meredith Goff claimed gold and silver, respectively.

Northern Kentucky earned first place in the women's 4x100m relay by clocking at 46.46.

On the men's side, Natnael Weldemichael made history by setting a new championship record and taking the top spot in the men's 5000m run by clocking in at 14:18.43.

The NKU women finished fifth in the championship with 78 points, while the men finished seventh with 22 points.




SOFTBALL

Northern Kentucky Softball's 27-22 record marked the best in the NCAA Division I Era for Northern Kentucky, and their best record since the 2012 season. Their 14-10 conference record was their second-best mark in conference play since joining the Horizon League. Key performers included Ella LeMonier, who batted .384 and stole 19 bases; Olivia Pastin, who had 21 extra-base hits; and Lauryn Hicks, who led the team with 13 wins and a 3.09 ERA.

The Norse earned their second-ever win over a power conference school on March 11th, when they hosted and defeated the Michigan Wolverines 3-2. NKU also re-wrote the record book with a six-game conference winning streak, completing back-to-back sweeps of Green Bay and Purdue Fort Wayne in late March. It marked NKU's longest winning streak in conference play in the NCAA Division I era.

Tournament Run

After claiming a four seed in the Horizon League Championship, Northern Kentucky fell to Robert Morris in their first game, 7-2.

Tied with IU Indianapolis 2-2 in the sixth inning and staring down an early exit, Lexy Morris scored the game-winning run on a passed ball as the Norse started a magical run to the Horizon League Championship game.

Olivia Pastin went 3-3 and homered as the Norse took down Oakland the following Friday, and a six-run fifth inning against the hosts, Youngstown State, helped the Norse clinch a spot in the semifinals.

The Norse then defeated Robert Morris in the semis behind a complete game shutout from Lauryn Hicks, winning 5-0.

Needing to win both games to claim a Horizon League Championship title, Trinity Robertson delivered in a tie game in the top of the seventh, hitting a game-winning RBI single that brought the Norse just one game away from being crowned Horizon League Champions again.

But in the season finale, the Norse fell to Cleveland State, 6-1, ending their magical run.



BASEBALL



Northern Kentucky Baseball authored one of the most remarkable turnarounds in NCAA history, capping a four-year climb with a Horizon League Tournament title and the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance in 2024. After going winless during the COVID-shortened 2020 season, the Norse steadily improved year-over-year, notching 17 wins in 2021, 19 in 2022, and setting a then-Division I era record with 30 wins in 2023. The 2024 season saw NKU shatter that mark with 35 victories, culminating in a Horizon League Championship.

The Norse delivered a signature moment in March, earning the program's first series win over a power conference opponent. NKU stunned the college baseball world by taking two of three on the road from SEC member Missouri. After a 3-1 victory in the series opener, the Norse closed the series with a thrilling 16-15 comeback win to secure the historic result.

Liam McFadden-Ackman led the individual charge, earning Horizon League Player of the Year honors and a First Team All-League selection. He led the conference in home runs, RBI, runs scored, and walks. He was joined on the First Team by John Odom, Cleary Simpson, Treyvin Moss, and Tanner Gillis.



NKU also had a strong presence on the Second Team with Tyler Shaneyfelt, Mitch Wood, and Clay Brock earning honors, while Jake Paulick was recognized on the All-Freshman Team. Head Coach Dizzy Peyton was named Horizon League Co-Coach of the Year.

NKU powered through the Horizon League Tournament with wins over Milwaukee, Wright State, and a commanding 23-5 championship victory against Youngstown State. Five Norse were named to the All-Tournament Team: Clay Brock, Logen Devenport, Tanner Gillis, Tyler Shaneyfelt, and Treyvin Moss, who was named Tournament MVP.



In the NCAA Tournament, NKU matched up against eventual national champion No. 1 Tennessee and a strong Southern Miss squad, showing resilience before their elimination.

Following the NCAA Regionals, the Norse made national headlines when Tennessee Head Coach Tony Vitello gifted the banners from the regional to Ryan "Mav" Mavriplis, NKU's special assistant to the head coach and head team manager, who has Down syndrome. NKU baseball participates annually in the Buddy Walk and is routinely commended for its community impact.

To cap off a historic year, pitcher Tanner Gillis signed with the Milwaukee Brewers in September, becoming the first Norse player to ink an MLB contract since 2022.

CROSS COUNTRY

Northern Kentucky Men's and Women's Cross Country kicked off the 2024 season with a bang, as both teams won the 41st annual Queen City Invitational, and Natnael Weldemichael and Grace Biddle won individual titles.

NKU's sweep in the Queen City Invitational, hosted at NKU's Valhalla course, was the first for any program in 18 years.

The Northern Kentucky women kept the hot streak going, following up their Queen City Invitational victory with another team win at Wright State's Baumer Classic.

Their back-to-back wins was a first-ever feat in the Division I era for head coach Steve Kruse's program.

Biddle finished third in the meet, with freshman standout Brittany Arnold close behind her, finishing fourth.



History at the League Championships

At the 2024 Horizon League Cross Country Championships, Northern Kentucky's men's team finished in fifth place, with Natnael Weldemichael and Colton O'Hara recording top-ten finishes.

The team's finish was their best since the 2018 season when they finished in fourth place.

Weldemichael's second-place finish was the second-highest for NKU since Andrew Schille won the league meet in 2017. 2024 marked the first time that NKU's men's team had a pair of All-League honorees.

On the women's side, Northern Kentucky finished eighth with three top-50 finishes (Brittany Arnold, Julia Verhoff, Carlie Condit).



WOMEN'S SOCCER

Northern Kentucky Women's Soccer continued its strong tradition of success with another standout season in 2024, making a return trip to the Horizon League Championship match for the second consecutive year.

The Norse posted a 12-7-1 overall record and an 8-1-1 mark in conference play to earn the No. 2 seed in the Horizon League Tournament.

NKU closed the regular season on fire, finishing unbeaten in its final nine matches—tied for the longest active streak in the nation at the time. In the Horizon League semifinals, the Norse edged Detroit Mercy in a 1-0 defensive battle to advance to the title match.

Joining her on the First Team was standout forward Lilly Yordy, who finished top 10 in the league in shots, goals, and shots on goal, while leading the conference in assists with seven.

Midfielder Kaya Vogt earned Second Team recognition, and freshman defender Caitlin Evans was named to the All-Freshman Team.



MEN'S SOCCER



In the squad's first game of the season at NKU Soccer Stadium, the Norse crowd showed up as they set the largest home attendance for an NKU Men's Soccer match since 2015, as 509 fans came out to see the Norse take on former GLVC foe Bellarmine.

Northern Kentucky's Men's Soccer program had a historic season, as the team set a program record in the Division I era for the longest unbeaten streak, an eight-match run from September 1 until October 12.

NKU's home crowd was consistently supportive throughout the season, with an average home attendance of 485, and a season-high of 612 on Senior Day against Milwaukee.

During the streak, the squad won a pair of matches and earned six draws, allowing opponents to score just five goals in eight games.

The Norse saw a home crowd of 450 or higher at six of their seven home matches.

A 3-0 home win over Western Illinois was the school's largest of the season, as Ali Taleb, Tyler Murphy, and Bennett Gerak all netted goals in the win.





Also during the historic streak, the Norse took down Cleveland State at home, 2-1, with Jason Purks recording a goal and an assist.

In head coach Liz Hart's 15th season at the helm, Northern Kentucky Volleyball battled through a challenging schedule to finish 11-18, picking up several notable wins and individual accolades along the way.

The Norse opened the year on a big stage, competing in the Bluegrass Battle hosted by ninth-ranked Kentucky at Historic Memorial Coliseum.

NKU earned a key win over in-state rival Morehead State to cap the weekend. The home schedule began with the NKU Invitational, where the Norse faced off against No. 4 Louisville, Missouri, and South Dakota.

NKU earned a sweep over the Coyotes and took a set from Missouri in a strong showing.



In their final home tournament of the season, NKU swept the weekend with a thrilling five-set win over Xavier and a straight-set victory over Miami (OH), highlighting the team's growth throughout the year.

Senior outside hitter Joy Banks had a standout campaign, earning Horizon League Player of the Week honors, reaching 1,000 career kills, and being named to the All-Horizon League Second Team.

Freshman outside hitter Allison Risley made an immediate impact, being named to the Bluegrass Battle All-Tournament Team and earning a spot on the Horizon League All-Freshman Team.



Senior Torie Houston surpassed 1,000 career assists during the season's opening weekend, while fellow graduate student Allie Siefke became the program's all-time leader in block assists.

Ivey Stocks was recognized for her leadership and integrity as a finalist for the Horizon League Sportsmanship Award.



TRIATHLON

Women's Tri

NKU Women's Triathlon officially launched its program in Fall 2024, completing a successful inaugural campaign that featured Top 5 team finishes in three races and the program's first appearance at Nationals.

The Norse made an early mark at the University of Indianapolis Super Sprint in September, placing all four competitors in the Top 20. Alisha Detmer led the group with a 10th-place finish, followed by Josie Timmers (13th), Sophie McEwen (15th), and Kelly Villanueva (16th).

In November, the Norse reached another milestone, competing in the program's first-ever National Championship. Detmer won her heat and placed first in Heat 3, while both NKU athletes who competed finished inside the Top 200 in a massive national field.

Success extended beyond competition, as the Norse were recognized for their academic excellence at season's end. NKU was named a CTCA Scholar All-American Team for the Fall 2024 Championship Season. Detmer also earned individual honors as a CTCA Scholar All-America Honorable Mention, recognizing student-athletes with a 3.5 GPA or higher who also competed at nationals.



Men's Tri

NKU Men's Triathlon continued its early development with a season that spanned both fall and spring. Will Griffith placed 13th at the Zoom Redhawk Triathlon in the fall.

In the spring, Griffith, Frederik Smal, and Johannes Smal competed at the Ohio State Indoor Triathlon in February, where all three Norse athletes placed inside the Top 30—Frederik Smal led the way with a sixth-place finish, followed by Griffith (10th) and Johannes Smal (30th).

The Norse capped the year by competing in the USAT Collegiate Club National Championships in Miami, Florida. All three NKU athletes finished inside the Top 500 in a highly competitive national field, marking another first for the emerging program.



SWIMMING

Northern Kentucky Swimming made a historic splash in its inaugural season, competing in six swim meets across the fall and spring semesters before concluding the year at the Horizon League Championships. The Norse set 18 new school records at the championship meet, capping the season with momentum and promise heading into year two.

In relay action, NKU's 200-yard medley relay team of Jeffrey Wenker, Tyler Cukovecki, Ethan Johnson, and Conner Norton earned 24 points with a school record time of 1:34.62.

The Norse also impressed in the 800-yard freestyle relay, as Frank Runge, Dimiter Zafirov, Jack Miranda, and Patrick Gibbons clocked in at 6:48.97—another program-best performance that earned 26 points.

Individually, Frank Runge was a standout, setting multiple school records, including in the 500-yard freestyle (4:33.09), breaking his own previous mark. Ethan Johnson established a new school record in the 200-yard IM with a time of 1:54.54.



In sprint events, Chloe Loftis posted a school record and personal best in the 50-yard freestyle (27.23), while Patrick Gibbons set the men's mark in the same event at 20.68.

Khizar Shah added to the record haul with a 50.37 in the 100-yard butterfly, establishing yet another school benchmark.

In total, the Norse set 61 school records during their inaugural season.



INDOOR TRACK AND FIELD

In NKU's 2025 indoor campaign, the Norse had many standout performers throughout the season, including single event victories from Olivia Kennedy, Julia Pohl, Cameron Bitterman, Stetson Childress, Jacob Line, and more.






Additionally, at the indoor championships, both the men's and women's squads notched sixth-place finishes, as Cameron Bitterman finished second in the 400m run and Julia Pohl finished third in the high jump.

On the men's side, Kaden Gardner finished third in the heptathlon, winning the high jump in the event.

Colton O'Hara placed twice at the meet, earning a fourth-place finish in the 3000m run and a seventh-place finish in the 5000m.

Jacob and Brady Messer both earned points for NKU in the 800m run, while Alden Williams earned an eighth-place finish in the triple jump.



Northern Kentucky STUNT made history in its inaugural season in 2025, competing as a member of the Mid-America West Conference.

The Norse showed steady progress throughout the campaign and picked up the program's first-ever victory in March, defeating Centenary College 8-5 at the Skyhawk Invitational in Martin, Tennessee.

Earlier in the season, NKU impressed in a hard-fought matchup against power conference opponent Purdue, recording a season-best 10 points in a closely contested February matchup against the Boilermakers.

Capping off the historic first season, Kari Crabtree etched her name into the record books by becoming the first Norse student-athlete to earn all-conference honors in program history. She was named to the Mid-America West Conference Second Team.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Northern Kentucky Women's Basketball started a new era in its 2024-25 season, welcoming Jeff Hans as the sixth head coach in Norse Women's Basketball history.

Hans previously had stints with the program as an assistant coach and graduate assistant and had most recently led Thomas More's women's basketball program through a dominant stretch, going 339-42 and winning a trio of National Championships at different levels.

In Hans' first season as head coach, he led the Norse to a fifth-place finish in the Horizon League and a quarterfinal berth in the Horizon League Tournament.




Notable statistical achievers include senior guard Macey Blevins, who led the team in scoring with 12.6 points per game. Blevins also contributed 3.7 rebounds, 2.7 assists, and 1.5 steals and scored her 1,000th career point against Wright State on February 1st.

Graduate transfer Halle Idowu had a standout season in her lone year with NKU, averaging 12.4 points and 6.1 rebounds, both top-two marks on the team.

Senior wing Mya Meredith also had a stellar season, averaging 10.7 points, 6.0 rebounds, and 1.5 steals.

Freshman guard Kamora Morgan was named to the Horizon League's All-Freshman Team, averaging 7.6 points per game with three 20+ point games.

Point guard Jaci Jones recorded the second-highest assist / turnover ratio for the Norse in the Division I era, with a mark of 2.05.



The Norse picked up a handful of signature wins throughout the season, including their very first of the year, a 80-78 triumph on the road over Marshall. In the game, Idowu scored a season-high for any Norse with 29 points, and Macey Blevins drilled a game-winning corner three for a thrilling victory.

On January 11, the Norse dismantled IU Indy on a historic day, as the 2000 National Championship team was recognized at halftime of the game.

In perhaps their most exciting game of the year, NKU stormed back from a 14-point second half deficit against Cleveland State, a top team in the conference. In the 72-69 win, NKU tied a program record with 16 made three pointers.







MEN'S BASKETBALL

Northern Kentucky Men's Basketball continued its run of consistency under head coach Darrin Horn. The 2024-25 season marked the ninth consecutive season with a winning record, and the fifth under Coach Horn.

The Norse posted a 17-16 overall mark, highlighted by a pair of five-game winning streaks and several historic individual milestones.

Senior forward Trey Robinson earned All-League Third Team honors after leading NKU in both scoring and rebounding. Robinson etched his name into the program's history books by scoring his 1,000th career point in the Horizon League opener against IU Indy, a game in which he also delivered the game-winning layup to ignite a five-game win streak.

That stretch included victories over IU Indy, University of the Cumberlands, Norfolk State, Detroit Mercy, and South Carolina State between December 7 and December 21.



The Norse also saw senior guard and Northern Kentucky native Sam Vinson join the 1,000-point club, reaching the milestone in a nonconference matchup against Akron in December. Vinson capped off a decorated career by moving into second place all-time in program history in career steals.

NKU closed the regular season with momentum, rattling off four straight wins from February 21 to March 1, before adding a fifth consecutive win in the Horizon League Tournament first round with a victory over Detroit Mercy.

Another major milestone came on December 7, when Head Coach Darrin Horn secured his 100th career win at NKU with a 66-64 triumph over IU Indy.





The Fall 2024 season saw the Norse continue their momentum, finishing in the top half of the field in five of six tournaments.






Women's Golf

Ana Isabela Serrano and Fisk have posted the best doubles record on the team, going 7-4 on the year.



Jill Wilhelm won the javelin, setting a program record, while Natnael Weldemichael won the 5000m race.



The Norse swept Green Bay at home and Oakland on the road and grabbed a home victory over Cleveland State to achieve the feat.


Northern Kentucky finished 22-25 with a 12-10 conference record, earning the fifth seed in the conference championship.


NORTHERN KENTUCKY UNIVERSITY ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE¹

(9) The university has received a gift that will support an endowed scholarship for students majoring in nursing or a related field. The university will apply for matching funds from the Kentucky Council on Postsecondary Education's 2022-2024 Endowment Match Program for this gift.

Donor: Martha Pelfrey
Naming Gift: \$50,000
Naming Recognition: Martha Pelfrey Nursing Endowed Scholarship

As the first member of her family to graduate from college, Martha Pelfrey earned her degree from NKU in 1979. She spent her career in education, teaching at the elementary grade level. Martha is passionate about education and like her late husband W. Frank Steely believes education is transformative. Martha has established two scholarships at NKU since her beloved husband's passing in 2010 and is pleased to create yet another scholarship, this time in support of deserving future healthcare professionals.

(10) The university has received a gift that will support students in the Nurse Anesthesia Program with experiential learning opportunities, including travel to conferences or other professional development opportunities. The fund will be managed by the Nurse Anesthesia Program.

(12) The university has received a grant to pilot a program for motivated and academically high-performing graduates of the Young Scholars Academy (YSA) who are pursuing studies in the College of Education (COE) at NKU. This program was funded by a grant from the Carol Ann and Ralph V. Haile, Jr. Foundation. This opportunity will target graduates of YSA whose home high schools are within the region's lowest-performing districts and who are graduating with a minimum 3.0 GPA. For the recipients, components of this program include: an annual tuition

discount, employment each year as a counselor with an NKU-sponsored K-12 summer camp, a “scholar agreement” requiring the student fellow to participate in mentoring and tutoring programs at schools in their home district, a teaching commitment of at least two years in a Title 1 school or in an area of critically needed specialization upon graduation and certification (pending district needs and position availability), and a one-time housing stipend for each graduate of the program who achieves certification and employment. These funds will also support the annual recruiting costs associated with this opportunity and an annual stipend for a COE faculty member to serve as a cohort leader.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board of Regents approve a revision to the Research Misconduct policy and a corresponding revision to the Faculty Policies and Procedures Handbook.

BACKGROUND:

In February 2025, the Board of Regents approved revisions to the Research Misconduct policy, to add new health/safety protections suggested during a routine review by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Office of Research Integrity.

After the Board approved those changes, Faculty Senate approved additional changes to clarify the policy's definition of "research misconduct." Those changes are reflected in the attached proposal.

Administration recommends that the Board approve these revisions to the Research Misconduct policy and to corresponding language in the Faculty Policies and Procedures Handbook. The Faculty Senate already has approved the revisions to the Handbook language.

I. POLICY STATEMENT

The preeminent principle in all research is the quest for truth. The credibility of such research must be above reproach if the public trust is to be maintained. Any compromise of the ethical standards required for conducting academic research cannot be condoned. While breaches in such standards are rare, these must be dealt with promptly and fairly by all parties in order to preserve the integrity of the research community.

A critical element of any policy on research misconduct is that it be a fair and effective process for distinguishing instances of genuine and serious misconduct from insignificant deviations from acceptable practices, technical violations of rules, or simple carelessness. This policy allows such distinctions to be made in a manner that minimizes disruption and protects the honest researcher from false or mistaken accusations.

Research misconduct, as defined in Section IV below, is not condoned at Northern Kentucky University (NKU) and allegations of such misconduct will be investigated in accordance with the procedures described below. The policy and procedure discussed herein do not restrict or limit any legal options available to any of the parties through appropriate courts and/or administrative agencies. NKU must comply with federal regulations, and additional policies may apply to those engaged in federally sponsored research or submitting work to a federal agency.

II. ENTITIES AFFECTED

All faculty and staff engaged in research at Northern Kentucky University.

This policy has been adapted from Section 16.7 “Scientific/Research Misconduct” of the Faculty Handbook.

NOTE: If the person against whom an allegation of research misconduct is directed or who is the subject of a research misconduct proceeding does not report through the Dean/Provost channel, then in the processes and procedures described throughout this policy, the appropriate supervisor (or designee) and appropriate Vice President shall be involved rather than the Dean and the Provost.

III. AUTHORITY

Public Health Services Policies on Research Misconduct, Department of Health and Human Services, Title 42 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 93 (42 CFR Part 93).

IV. DEFINITIONS

Complainant: Complainant means a person who in good faith makes an allegation of research misconduct.

Good Faith: Good faith, as applied to a complainant or witness, means having a belief in the truth of one's allegation or testimony that a reasonable person in the complainant's or witness's position could have based on the information known to the complainant or witness at the time. An allegation or cooperation with a research misconduct proceeding is not in good faith if made with knowing or reckless disregard for information that would negate the allegation or testimony. Good faith as applied to a committee member means cooperating with the research misconduct proceeding by carrying out the duties assigned impartially for the purpose of helping an institution meet its responsibilities under this part. A committee member does not act in good faith if their acts or omissions on the committee are dishonest or influenced by personal, professional, or financial conflicts of interest with those involved in the research misconduct proceeding.

Inquiry: Inquiry means preliminary information-gathering and preliminary fact-finding.

Investigation: Investigation means the formal collection, examination, and evaluation of all relevant facts to determine whether research misconduct has occurred.

Research Misconduct: Research misconduct is defined as fabrication, falsification, plagiarism, [text recycling in the form of duplicate publication](#), or other serious deviations from those accepted practices in proposing, performing, or reviewing research, or in reporting results from research.

- Fabrication is making up data or results and recording or reporting them.
- Falsification is manipulating research materials, equipment, or processes, or changing or omitting data or results such that the research is not accurately represented in the research record.
- Plagiarism is the appropriation of another person's ideas, processes, results, or words without giving appropriate credit.
- Text recycling in the form of duplicate publication is the recycling of the entirety or core content of a published work for the same audience and/or genre. It does not include developmental recycling (recycling material from unpublished documents produced as part of the research and writing process), generative recycling (recycling a limited amount of published material in a new work that offers a substantive and original intellectual contribution), or adaptive publication (recycling the entirety or core content of a published work but for a different readership, or genre).

Research misconduct does not include honest error or differences of opinion.

In cases of allegations involving activities submitted to or supported by a federal agency and definitions or procedures for research misconduct specified in the agency's regulations differ from those in this policy, the definitions and procedures in the agency's regulations will be used.

Research Record: Research record means the record of data or results that embody the facts resulting from scientific inquiry, including but not limited to, research proposals, laboratory records, both physical and electronic, progress reports, abstracts, theses, oral presentations, internal reports, journal

articles, and any documents and materials provided to federal agencies or institutional officials by a respondent in the course of the research misconduct proceeding.

Respondent: Respondent means the person against whom an allegation of research misconduct is directed or who is the subject of a research misconduct proceeding.

Retaliation: Retaliation for the purpose of this part means an adverse action taken against a complainant, witness, or committee member by an institution or one of its members in response to (a) a good faith allegation of research misconduct or (b) good faith cooperation with a research misconduct proceeding.

V. CONFIDENTIALITY

All parties involved in the inquiry and investigation shall strive to maintain confidentiality of the following, which may be identified from research records or evidence:

- information
- respondents
- complainants, and
- research subjects.

VI. INTERIM ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION

Throughout the research misconduct proceeding, the Dean (or designee) or Provost will review the situation to determine if there is any threat of harm to public health, federal funds and equipment, or the integrity of the Public Health Services (PHS)-supported research process. And in the event of such a threat, will, in consultation with other institutional officials and the Office of Research Integrity (ORI), take appropriate interim action to protect against any such threat. Interim action might include additional monitoring of the research process and the handling of federal funds and equipment, reassignment of personnel or of the responsibility for the handling of federal funds and equipment, additional review of research data and results or delaying publication. The Dean (or designee) or Provost shall, at any time during a research misconduct proceeding, notify ORI immediately if there is reason to believe that any of the following conditions exist:

- Health or safety of the public is at risk, including an immediate need to protect human or animal subjects;
- Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) resources or interests are threatened;
- Research activities should be suspended;
- There is a reasonable indication of possible violations of civil or criminal law;
- Federal action is required to protect the interests of those involved in the research misconduct proceeding;
- The research misconduct proceeding may be made public prematurely and HHS action may be necessary to safeguard evidence and protect the rights of those involved; or
- The research community or public should be informed.

As provided by federal regulations, at any stage in the process of inquiry, investigation, formal finding and disposition, NKU may take interim administrative action to protect the welfare of human or animal

subjects of research, to prevent the inappropriate use of funds, or to protect the interest of students, colleagues, or the University. A suspension or restriction of activities does not in any way imply that research misconduct has taken place. This action will be temporary and used as an interim measure prior to the conclusion of the formal investigation.

VII. EXTRAMURAL ASSURANCE AND REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

If applicable, NKU will fully and continually cooperate with the appropriate federal agency during its oversight review or any subsequent administrative hearings or appeals. This may include providing research records and evidence under the institution's control, custody, or possession and access to all persons within its authority necessary to develop a complete record of relevant evidence. If required by a funding agency, the Institutional Official (IO) or designee shall submit written assurance that the institution is in compliance with the agency's requirements for handling allegations of misconduct. If the research is supported by an extramural funding agency, the IO or designee is responsible for ensuring compliance with the applicable funding agency's reporting requirements.

VIII. STATUTE OF LIMITATION

NKU will only investigate research misconduct that has occurred within six (6) years of the date that the institution receives an allegation of research misconduct. This six-year limitation does not apply to the following circumstances:

- 1) Subsequent use by the respondent by continuation or renewal of any incident of alleged research misconduct that occurred before the six (6) year limitation through the citation, re-publication or other use for the potential benefit of the respondent of the research record that is alleged to have been fabricated, falsified, or plagiarized.
- 2) If the appropriate funding agency or the University in consultation with the funding agency determines that the alleged misconduct, if it occurred, would possibly have a substantial adverse effect on the health or safety of the public.

IX. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

Individuals responsible for carrying out any part of the research misconduct proceeding must not have any real or apparent unresolved personal, professional, or financial conflicts of interest with the complainant, respondent, or witnesses. Any conflict of interest must be disclosed.

A conflict of interest may include, but is not limited to, co-authorship on a paper or book, a professional or personal relationship or antagonism, financial ties, or contact regarding possible employment with either the respondent or the complainant.

X. ABSENCE OF THE RESPONDENT OF THE ALLEGATION

Should the respondent leave NKU before the case is resolved, the Dean (or supervisor if the respondent does not report to a Dean), on behalf of NKU, when possible, shall continue the examination of the allegation and reach a conclusion. NKU shall cooperate with the process of another institution to resolve such questions to the extent possible under state and federal law.

XI. RESTORING REPUTATION

The Dean (or designee) or Provost, shall undertake all practical and reasonable efforts to protect and restore the reputation of the individual(s) alleged to have engaged in research misconduct but against whom no finding of research misconduct has been made, if requested by the individual(s) as appropriate.

The Dean (or designee) or Provost, shall undertake reasonable and practical efforts to protect or restore the position and reputation of the individual(s) who in good faith, made an allegation of research misconduct, if requested by the individual(s) and as appropriate.

The Dean (or designee) or Provost shall undertake reasonable and practical efforts to protect or restore the position and reputation of any complainant, witness, or committee member and to counter potential or actual retaliation against these individuals.

As stated in Section II above, if the individual does not report through the Dean/Provost channel, then the appropriate supervisor (or designee) and appropriate Vice President shall be involved rather than the Dean and Provost.

XII. FALSE ACCUSATIONS

Regardless of the outcome of an inquiry or investigation, it is the policy of the University that no individual who, in good faith, has reported apparent research misconduct shall be subject to retaliation by the University or by any member of the University community. However, if it is determined that the charges were brought against the respondent with malicious or dishonest intent such that the complainant had a clear understanding that they were probably untrue and that they were designed to harm the respondent, the Dean may recommend to the Provost that appropriate administrative action be taken against the complainant consistent with University policy (see NOTE in Section II above).

XIII. PROCEDURES

A. ALLEGATIONS OF RESEARCH MISCONDUCT

It is the policy of Northern Kentucky University to treat fairly both the complainant and the respondent. All allegations of research misconduct will be treated seriously and, to the extent possible, the confidentiality of those who submit allegations will be maintained.

Though allegations of research misconduct may be by any means of communication to an institutional or federal official, the allegation of misconduct shall initially be documented in writing by either the complainant or the person receiving the allegation. If the allegation is made through the Ethics and Compliance Helpline, the person receiving the allegation should document the allegation in writing. Any other person receiving an allegation of research misconduct should relay the information to the appropriate Dean (or other supervisor if the individual does not report to a Dean) for preliminary inquiry. The Provost (or other Vice President if the individual does not report to a Dean) may receive reports of research misconduct in situations where the appropriate Dean or supervisor may have a conflict of interest.

Either before or when the institution notifies the respondent of the allegation, inquiry, or investigation, the institution must promptly take all reasonable and practical steps to obtain custody of all the research records and evidence needed to conduct the research misconduct proceeding, inventory the records

and evidence, and sequester them in a secure manner, except that where the research records or evidence encompass scientific instruments shared by a number of users, custody may be limited to copies of the data or evidence on such instruments, so long as those copies are substantially equivalent to the evidentiary value of the instruments. Respondents may be given supervised access to the research records throughout the inquiry and/or investigation.

B. PRELIMINARY INQUIRY

The purpose of the preliminary inquiry is to conduct an initial review of evidence to determine if there are sufficient grounds to warrant a formal investigation of the charge of research misconduct. An inquiry is warranted if the allegation:

- Falls within the definition of research misconduct
- Is within 42 CFR Part 93.102, and
- Is sufficiently credible and specific so that potential evidence of research misconduct may be identified.

The preliminary inquiry will be conducted by the Dean of the college in which the respondent faculty or staff member is appointed.

As stated in Section II above, if the respondent does not report through the Dean/Provost channel, then the appropriate supervisor (or designee) and appropriate Vice President shall be involved rather than the Dean and Provost.

If the allegation of misconduct is brought against a Dean, the Provost will appoint another Dean to conduct the inquiry. The Dean will notify university legal counsel and the Provost regarding the nature of the allegations. University Counsel shall determine whether the research at issue is governed by any federal legal regulations and shall instruct the Dean to ensure that the preliminary inquiry is conducted in compliance with any applicable regulations. When deemed necessary, the Dean may select one or two other individuals to assist in the preliminary inquiry. Any such individuals should have no real or apparent conflict of interest related to the case in question. A conflict of interest may include, but is not limited to, co-authorship on a paper or book, a professional or personal relationship or antagonism, financial ties, or contact regarding possible employment with either the accused or the complainant (see Section IX Conflict of Interest above).

On or before the date the respondent is notified or the inquiry begins, whichever is earlier, the Dean (or designee) or Provost will take all reasonable and practical steps to:

1. Obtain custody of all research records and evidence needed for the research misconduct proceeding, and
2. Inventory and securely sequester the records and evidence in a secure manner.

If the research records or evidence includes scientific instruments shared by multiple users, custody may be limited to copies of the data or evidence, provided these copies are substantially equivalent in evidentiary value to the original instruments.

The preliminary inquiry should begin with an informal discussion with the complainant to verify that the allegation should be classified as possible research misconduct. Within ten (10) business days after this discussion with the complainant, the Dean shall begin an informal discussion with the respondent

regarding the allegations. If federal or state regulations so require, the Dean shall also present the respondent with a letter that states:

- the nature of the allegations;
- the focus of the inquiry;
- an invitation to the respondent to provide comments and other relevant information to the Dean;
- other relevant information; and
- a statement that the respondent has the right to be represented by an attorney.

The preliminary inquiry should be completed within sixty (60) days of receipt of the written allegation of misconduct. If the preliminary inquiry determines that there are not sufficient grounds within the context of the definition of misconduct for a formal investigation, the respondent and the complainant will be sent letters informing them of the results. All records will be sent to the Office of the Provost.

A formal investigation will be found to be warranted if:

- a) A reasonable basis for concluding that the allegation falls within the definition of research misconduct; and
- b) Preliminary information-gathering and preliminary fact-finding from the inquiry indicate the allegation may have substance.

If the preliminary inquiry determines that there are sufficient grounds for a formal investigation within the context of the definition of misconduct, the respondent and the complainant will be sent letters informing them of this decision. The letter to the respondent may include, but is not limited to, the following:

- The name and position of the respondent(s);
- That a formal investigation is to be conducted;
- Information pertaining to federal agencies involved, including funding numbers, grant applications, contracts, etc., if applicable;
- The nature of the allegation, including a summary of all evidence that currently exists and the right to review it;
- The basis for recommending that the alleged actions warrant an investigation;
- That the respondent will have an opportunity to respond to the charges; and
- That the respondent has the right to be represented by an attorney.

The respondent shall have the opportunity to respond to this letter, in writing, within thirty (30) calendar days of the date on which the respondent receives it. The draft preliminary inquiry report, combined with any comments received from the respondent, shall constitute the preliminary inquiry report.

In the event a formal investigation is deemed to be warranted, the Dean shall inform the following individuals and/or organizations: university legal counsel, chairs/directors of any departments/schools that may be involved, the Provost, and appropriate regulatory bodies. As required by law or regulation, University Counsel shall notify appropriate government agencies when a formal investigation is convened.

As described in Section XII False Accusations above, if a formal investigation is judged to be unwarranted and it is determined that the charges were brought against the respondent with malicious or dishonest intent such that the complainant had a clear understanding that they were probably untrue and that they were designed to harm the respondent, the Dean may recommend to the Provost that

appropriate administrative action be taken against the complainant. Such appropriate administrative action shall be consistent with University policy.

Any records produced during the preliminary inquiry stage, including the preliminary inquiry report, must be maintained by University Counsel for at least seven (7) years and, upon request, be provided to the applicable government agencies.

C. FORMAL INVESTIGATION

Before any formal investigation commences, the respondent(s) and any involved collaborators must be notified by written statement of allegations that an investigation is to be conducted. The written statement shall:

- Include a copy of the preliminary inquiry report, which includes information on the nature of the allegations and the focus of the investigation, and inform those being investigated of the opportunity to provide comments and other relevant information to the Dean.
- Inform the respondent(s), prior to beginning the investigation, of their right to be represented by an attorney in preparing and/or giving their response in this and all subsequent phases of the investigation.
- Give the respondent a copy of or refer to the institution's policies and procedures related to research misconduct.
- Indicate there can be no actions that are, or could be perceived as, retaliatory against the investigation committee members, witnesses, or the person who raised an allegation or is thought to have raised an allegation.

The Dean (or supervisor, if the respondent does not report to a Dean) shall appoint an Investigative Body (IB) with three or more members to initiate an investigation thirty (30) calendar days after receipt of the preliminary inquiry report. IB members must be tenured faculty members with sufficient expertise in the area of investigation to ensure a sound base from which to evaluate the nature of the charges. One member of the IB may be from outside the University, if necessary, to ensure an accurate and knowledgeable evaluation of the evidence. All IB members must be free of real or apparent conflicts of interest regarding the investigation. The Dean (or supervisor) shall document the rationale for selecting committee members based on their expertise and impartiality. All IB members shall be required to sign a statement that they will maintain the confidentiality of the investigation, and that they have no interest that would conflict with those of the accused, the complainant, the University, or the sponsoring agency for the research. Prior to the beginning of the formal investigation, the respondent shall be given the opportunity to object in writing to the appointment of any member of the IB, based on conflict of interest. If the member is appointed to the IB despite the respondent's objection, this fact shall be noted in the IB's final report.

The IB shall conduct a formal examination and evaluation of all relevant facts to determine if the allegations of misconduct are valid. In order to maintain the integrity of the review process and avoid any appearance of institutional influence over the panel's deliberations or decision-making, the IB shall be insulated from any administrative influence and any *ex parte* communications with the parties. The IB shall seek the advice of University Counsel and may engage in, but is not limited to, the following investigative procedures:

- Interviewing witnesses;

- Sequestering and examining research data (both published and unpublished) and other evidence;
- Seeking expert counsel both inside and outside the University; and
- Conducting a hearing in which the respondent may respond to the charges, call witnesses, and question the complainant.

The IB shall pursue diligently all significant issues and leads discovered that are determined relevant to the investigation. A written summary or transcript of each interview conducted must be completed. A copy of the interview summary or transcript shall be provided to the interviewed party for comment.

The investigation must be completed within one hundred twenty (120) days of beginning it, including conducting the investigation, preparing the report findings, providing the draft report for comment, and, if applicable, sending the final report to the appropriate federal agency. If a federal agency is to be involved, the IB must notify the Provost (or appropriate Vice President), who will facilitate arrangements for the report to be sent. If the IB is unable to complete the investigation in time, a written request for extension that includes an explanation for the delay shall be submitted to and approved by the Provost (or appropriate Vice President) and be included in the investigation record. Exception: If no federal or state regulation requires the investigation to be completed within 120 days, then the timeline for a particular investigation shall automatically be extended until the IB completes the investigation, without any need for written request of extension.

A finding of research misconduct requires that acts constitute research misconduct as defined above and that:

- 1) There is a significant departure from accepted practices of the relevant research community;
- 2) The misconduct is committed intentionally, or knowingly, or recklessly; and
- 3) The allegation is proven by a preponderance of evidence.

D. INQUIRY REPORT AND INVESTIGATION DETERMINATION

The IB shall prepare a draft Investigation Report. The draft report will be sent to all respondents, and all respondents shall be afforded the opportunity to comment upon the draft report and have the comments included in the formal record of the investigation. Any comments shall be submitted in writing within thirty (30) calendar days of the date on which the respondents received the draft report. The IB shall review all respondents' comments prior to issuing the final Investigation Report.

At the completion of the Investigation, the IB shall submit its findings, comments from the respondents, and recommend institutional actions (also known as the Investigation Report) in writing to the Dean (or supervisor, if the respondent does not report to a Dean), who shall provide a copy to the respondents of the investigation, the provost, legal counsel, and chair(s)/director(s) of the affected department(s)/school(s). The Dean (or supervisor) shall ensure that publishers and editors of journals are informed if manuscripts emanating from fraudulent research have been submitted or published.

E. INVESTIGATION REPORT

The Investigation Report will include the following:

- 1) Description of the nature of the allegations of research misconduct
- 2) Description and documentation of federal financial support, if applicable (e.g., grant numbers, grant applications, contracts, etc.)

- 3) Institutional charge (e.g., description of specific allegations of research misconduct for consideration in the investigation)
- 4) Copy of the institutional policies and procedures under which the investigation was conducted
- 5) Research records and evidence. Identify and summarize the research records and evidence reviewed, and identify any evidence taken into custody but not reviewed.
- 6) Statement of findings. For each separate allegation of research misconduct identified during the investigation, provide
 - a) A finding as to whether research misconduct did or did not occur as follows:
 - i. Identify whether research misconduct was falsification, fabrication, plagiarism, or other serious deviation from accepted practices and if it was intentional, knowing, or in reckless disregard;
 - ii. A finding that serious research irregularities have occurred, but that the irregularities are insufficient to constitute misconduct; or
 - iii. A finding that no research misconduct or research irregularities were committed.
 - b) A summary of the facts and the analysis that support the conclusion and consideration of the merits of any reasonable explanation by the respondent;
 - c) Information about the specific federal support affected, if applicable;
 - d) Identification of any publications in need of correction and retraction;
 - e) Identification of the person(s) responsible for the misconduct;
 - f) Listing of any current support or known grant proposal applications that the respondent has pending with federal agencies.
- 7) Comments. Include and consider any comments made by the respondent and complainant on the draft investigation report.

The investigation must be thorough and sufficiently documented, including examination of all research records and evidence relevant to reaching a decision on the merits of the allegations. The IB must ensure that it maintains and provides all records from the investigation to the Provost. This is necessary so that they can be provided to any applicable federal agencies, which may request all relevant research records and records of the institution's research misconduct proceeding, including the results of all interviews and the transcripts or recordings of such interviews.

XIV. DOCUMENTATION

At the conclusion of an allegation assessment, inquiry, or investigation, the Dean shall forward all documentation pertaining to the allegation assessment, inquiry, or investigation to the Provost who shall arrange that the documentation be maintained for seven (7) years and ensure that documentation is provided to the appropriate federal agency upon request, if appropriate. As stated in Section II above, if the individual does not report through the Dean/Provost channel, then the appropriate supervisor (or designee) and appropriate Vice President shall be involved rather than the Dean/Provost.

Documentation to be maintained for federal agencies must include the following, as applicable:

- 1) Allegation assessment statement
- 2) Preliminary inquiry final report
- 3) Formal Investigation Report, including a copy of the report, all attachments, and any appeals

- 4) Findings: statement whether or not the institution accepts the investigation’s findings
- 5) Final institutional action: statement if the institution found research misconduct, and if so, who committed the misconduct
- 6) Institutional administrative actions: description of any pending or completed administrative actions against the respondents

The institution must notify the relevant federal agency (if applicable), if the institution plans to close out a case at the inquiry, investigation, or appeal stage on the basis that the respondent has admitted guilt, a settlement with the respondent has been reached, or for any other reason, except the closing of a case at the inquiry stage on the basis that an investigation is not warranted.

XV. DISCIPLINARY ACTION

If the findings of the investigation substantiate allegations of research misconduct, the Provost (or appropriate Vice President), in consultation with legal counsel, shall determine appropriate administrative action, consistent with University policy.

XVI. APPEAL

The respondent may appeal the decision of the investigative committee in writing to the Provost. The accused shall have thirty (30) days to file an appeal. A reinvestigation of the case will be warranted if one or more of the following conditions are judged by the Provost to exist:

- Significant omission of new evidence that was not known or reasonably available at the time of the formal investigation;
- A member of the committee had a conflict of interest; or
- A member of the committee did not accurately interpret the evidence due to lack of expertise concerning the research topic.

The Provost must rule within fifteen (15) days of receipt of the accused’s written appeal on whether or not an appeal is warranted. If the Provost determines that an appeal is warranted, a new investigative committee will be appointed by the Provost to reexamine the case. The Provost’s ruling on the issue of appeal is final. The criteria for appointing members to the original investigative committee shall also apply to the qualifications of members of the new investigative committee. The procedures that applied to the original investigative committee will also apply to the new investigative committee. The new committee shall have one hundred twenty (120) days to complete the investigation. The decision of this review committee is final.

As stated in Section II above, if the individual does not report through the Dean/Provost channel, then the appropriate Vice President shall be involved rather than the Provost.

16.7.2.5. Research Misconduct

Research misconduct is defined as fabrication, falsification, plagiarism, or other serious deviations from those accepted practices in proposing, performing, or reviewing research, or in reporting results from research.

- Fabrication is making up data or results and recording or reporting them.
- Falsification is manipulating research materials, equipment, or processes, or changing or omitting data or results such that the research is not accurately represented in the research record.
- Plagiarism is the appropriation of another person's ideas, processes, results, or words without giving appropriate credit.

Research misconduct does not include honest error or differences of opinion.

In cases of allegations involving activities submitted to or supported by a federal agency and definitions or procedures for research misconduct specified in the agency's regulations differ from those in this policy, the definitions and procedures in the agency's regulations will be used.

Proposed Amendment:

16.7.2.5. Research Misconduct

Research misconduct is defined as fabrication, falsification, plagiarism, **text recycling in the form of duplicate publication**, or other serious deviations from those accepted practices in proposing, performing, or reviewing research, or in reporting results from research. **Common disciplinary practices and/or guidelines may differ between academic units and, therefore, may be followed as deemed appropriate by the individual unit.**

- Fabrication is making up data or results and recording or reporting them.
- Falsification is manipulating research materials, equipment, or processes, or changing or omitting data or results such that the research is not accurately represented in the research record.
- Plagiarism is the appropriation of another person's ideas, processes, results, or words without giving appropriate credit.
- **Text recycling in the form of duplicate publication is the recycling of the entirety or core content of a published work for the same audience and/or genre. It does not include developmental recycling (recycling material from unpublished documents produced as part of the research and writing process), generative recycling (recycling a limited amount of published material in a new work that offers a substantive and original intellectual contribution), or adaptive publication (recycling the entirety or core content of a published work but for a different readership, or genre.).**

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board of Regents certify the University's compliance with Kentucky House Bill 4.

BACKGROUND:

In March 2025, the Kentucky General Assembly enacted House Bill 4, which prohibits a wide range of diversity, equity, and inclusion initiatives, offices, and programs at Kentucky's public universities. In particular, the law prohibits use of "discriminatory concepts" – efforts to justify or promote differential treatment, or to provide benefits to individuals, based on religion, race, sex, color, or national origin. The law includes exceptions for academic course content, academic research and related grant funding, and First Amendment and academic freedom rights of faculty, students, and student organizations, among other things.

The new law requires that university governing boards ensure that their institutions achieve compliance by June 30, 2025.

In response, the University has made the changes necessary to comply, including:

- The former Center for Student Inclusiveness, which housed African American Student Initiatives, Latino Student Initiatives, and LGBTQA+ Student Initiatives, has been repurposed as the Norse Center for Belonging, which will direct its efforts to the entire campus community, including first-generation college students and commuter students with an aim to mentor and connect.
- Scholarship criteria based on religion, race, sex, color, or national origin will not be honored, and the corresponding awards will either be modified to comply with the law or returned to the donor. The University's Educational Diversity and Access Scholarship has been renamed the Educational Access and Success Scholarship, and it will continue to be awarded without regard to the demographic categories named in the law.
- The Inclusive Excellence Council has been repurposed as the Campus Community Council, to advise on matters of importance to all employees, and other employee affinity groups based on demographic categories have been dissolved.
- The University will not sponsor or fund prohibited DEI training, conferences, or other programming. The former DEI office and the associated position were dissolved in August 2024.

With these changes, the University is now in compliance with House Bill 4.

By the same token, the University will continue activities permitted by House Bill 4, including academic teaching and research in disciplines that touch on issues of race, sex and religion, and related educational programs. Student organizations also may engage in activities organized around identity groups, including affinity graduation ceremonies and mentoring programs.

Note that over the last several months, University administrators have consulted extensively with campus leaders and others about the new law and its effects, including leaders and members of Faculty Senate, Staff Congress, and the Student Government Association, general student and employee open-forum audiences, and other interested campus leaders and groups.

RESOLUTION

COMPLIANCE WITH HOUSE BILL 4

WHEREAS, in March 2025, the Kentucky General Assembly enacted House Bill 4, which prohibits a wide range of diversity, equity, and inclusion initiatives at Kentucky's public universities; and

WHEREAS, House Bill 4 requires that each university governing board must ensure its institution's compliance with the law no later than June 30, 2025.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Regents, in consultation with the President, has determined that the University has complied with House Bill 4.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board of Regents authorize the administration to initiate and increase the scope of the capital projects listed below, pursuant to the Board Finance and Transactions Approval policy.

BACKGROUND:

1. **Regents Hall Plumbing/Restroom Renovation.** Approval is requested to initiate a project totaling \$1,350,000 using asset preservation funds to replace the plumbing infrastructure.
2. **Steely Library HVAC Replacement.** The Board approved this project with a scope of \$10,100,000 at the November 12, 2024 meeting, using asset preservation funds. We had earlier decided not to include replacement of the existing dual-duct HVAC system in two areas of the building, and now that design is underway, the recommendation is to replace the dual-duct system with a modern VAV system to provide improved occupant comfort and increased energy efficiency. Also, due to the fact that ceilings throughout the building will be removed and replaced to facilitate HVAC replacement, this is the time to replace sprinkler heads throughout this 50-year-old building. The new scope, using AP funds, is \$12,600,000.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board of Regents grant an exemption from the LEED Certification requirements in the Commonwealth's High-Performance Building Standards (KRS 56.775 / 200 KAR 6:070) for the Steely Library HVAC Replacement and the Civic Center Renovation projects.

BACKGROUND:

The Commonwealth's High-Performance Building Standards require LEED 2009 compliance for projects above \$5M in scope. Per KRS 56.775 / 200 KAR 6:070, exemptions can be granted by the Board of Regents or the Secretary of Finance. As major renovations between \$5M and \$25M, the Steely HVAC and Civic Center renovation projects would be required to comply with the certified-level requirements in the 2009 LEED for New Construction scorecard and achieve a minimum of seven points in the "Optimize Energy Performance" category.

Steely HVAC, at \$10,010,000, and the Civic Center renovation, at \$16,200,000, have construction scopes that fall within the certified category of compliance. The Steely project is full HVAC replacement only, and the Civic Center project is a full life-cycle renovation, including changes to re-purpose the building for the KY Medical Examiner's Northern Kentucky office and the Northern Kentucky Crime Lab.

The design and engineering teams for these two projects determined that certification is not feasible. With regard to the Civic Center, KY Justice Cabinet and Finance Cabinet representatives are in agreement about seeking an exemption for this project.

These projects do incorporate responsible initiatives for sustainable design practice. Such initiatives include how materials are demolished, the type of new mechanical systems specified, and selection of sustainable interior building materials. For example, LED lighting, vacancy/occupancy sensors, and dimming controls will be specified for lighting replacements. These items align with requirements of the "Optimize Energy Performance" and "Interior Lighting" LEED credits. Efficient plumbing fixtures will be utilized where fixtures are replaced. HVAC upgrades include changing from multi-zone air handlers to VAV reheat systems, which will provide some energy savings compared to the existing systems. HVAC zoning will be significantly improved, which would align with the "Thermal Comfort" LEED credit.

System commissioning included in the projects will ensure systems are operating correctly and efficiently as designed.

Upon approval of this recommendation, per 200 KAR 6:070 Section 3 (4), notification of exemption approval by the Board will be sent to the Secretary of Finance for informational purposes only.

RECOMMENDATION:

Propose that the Board of Regents authorize the Vice President for Administration and Finance to write off student account bad debts totaling \$6,842,923.53.

BACKGROUND:

Student Account Services is seeking authorization to write off accounts receivable balances that have been deemed uncollectible. The request is primarily due to the closure of the Kentucky Department of Revenue as a collection option. NKU received notification from the Department of Revenue Office of Enforcement on March 19, 2025, which stated, in part:

Please be advised that the Kentucky Department of Revenue will exercise its rights under KRS 45.238 (2)(a) to cease collection activities on your behalf. Manpower constraints at the DOR necessitate a move to concentrate on the collection of delinquent taxes for the Commonwealth.

The University's accounts receivable practice to this point has been to contact students via phone, email, and written correspondence to collect the balance due. When all attempts to make contact are unsuccessful, we forward the debt to a professional collection agency for six months. After six months at the collection agency, all accounts with no activity are then returned to NKU. Upon return, domestic student accounts were referred to the Kentucky Department of Revenue for second placement. The Kentucky Department of Revenue continues to collect on old debt, dating back to our initial placements with DOR in 2011. The bad debts that we are requesting to be written off were placed with the DOR before fiscal year 2022 and have had very limited or no payment activity since 2022. In addition, we are requesting to write off balances for students who have limited collection options, international students, school-based scholars, and those who were discharged in federal bankruptcy. The breakdown of accounts is provided below.

Student Account Services will contact debtors placed with the DOR since 2022 and those who have been making regular payments with the DOR. If no satisfactory payment or payment arrangement can be reached, that debt will be placed with a professional collection agency. Moving forward, we will allow the agency one year to collect before forwarding to a second agency. Again, the second agency will have an additional year to collect before placing the account with a third agency for another year.

Although the accounts receivable will be written off, all existing financial and registration holds on each student record will remain in place to prevent future registration or diploma release until payment is made in full.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board of Regents approve a revision to the Foundation of Knowledge (FOK) or General Education program policy.

BACKGROUND:

The current Foundation of Knowledge program policy was approved by the Board of Regents in 2012 and was revised in 2021. The current revisions increase the FOK course cap to 150 and include some updated considerations for those courses. Language was also added to clarify how new course proposals are considered and how current courses are assessed.

The Faculty Senate approved the revisions on March 31, 2025.

Foundation of Knowledge
Adopted May, 2012; revised Fall 2020
Passed by Faculty Senate, January 2021 meeting

The Foundation of Knowledge Program (FOK) is designed to be dynamic, maintaining enough flexibility to adapt to changing needs of students while also maintaining enough stability to facilitate:

- a focus on enhancing student learning in courses over time,
- integration of student learning from the knowledge areas into other courses (e.g., learning communities, vertical integration in a major, minor, or area of focus), and
- assessment of student performance relative to the stated outcomes of the Foundation of Knowledge program so that efforts to increase student learning are based on evidence-driven inquiry.

This evidence-driven practice will come from an assessment strategy that emphasizes formative and summative evaluation at the overarching program level, as well as at the level of the individual courses that make up the program.

A guiding principle of the changes to the General Education Program resulting in the Foundation of Knowledge Program was creating a coherent learning experience that prepares students for life and work in a rapidly changing 21st Century environment. The General Education Committee (GEC) is charged with guiding the program.

Foundation of Knowledge Program Structure

The Foundation of Knowledge Program is capped at 150 courses. The cap is intended to keep the program manageable and ensure high quality courses can be offered consistently for students.

The following considerations are included in this cap:

- Honors Program cohort courses that fulfill program requirements are included in this count.
- MAT 128 and 129 count as one course.
- Any variations of a course (i.e. STA 205 and STA 205R or courses with a companion lab) count as one course.

To ensure breadth of immersion in the general education program, only two courses with the same prefix can be used toward the completion of the general education requirements across the program categories of *Oral Communication*, *Mathematics & Statistics*, *Natural Science*, *Cultural Pluralism*, *Individual and Society*, *Culture and Creativity*, and *Global Viewpoints*. Courses completed in the *Written Communication* category do not count toward the two-prefix limit.

In meeting the broader *Scientific & Quantitative Inquiry*, *Self & Society*, and *Culture & Creativity* requirements, students may use only one course from any given discipline. Students may only apply one foreign language course in fulfillment of the *Culture & Creativity* category.

New Course Approval

Each fall, GEC members will determine whether new course proposals will be accepted for the following year. Members use assessment data, enrollment, and other analyses to monitor trends and needs within the program, including the need for courses in specific categories, student demand, and the diversity of courses within a category.

When new course proposals are accepted, a call for proposals will typically be issued early in the fall semester. Courses will go through the established curriculum process, including review by the GEC then sent to UCC for approval. GEC will review the proposal based on information provided in the new course proposal form and supporting documentation.

Program Review and Continuous Improvement

All courses are assessed once during an assessment cycle (approximately every 3-5 years). At the end of the assessment cycle, the Faculty Director of General Education will review all SLO assessment data collected across all categories and prepare a report for GEC. The report will include enrollment data and analysis of the extent to which outcomes of the Foundation of Knowledge Program are being met and provide recommendations for improving the program.

Every academic unit with an FOK course is required to: 1) include appropriate FOK category SLOs in the syllabus; 2) use FOK syllabus template; 3) seek continuous improvement in student learning through participation in general education assessment; and 4) offer the course at least once every two years.

The Faculty Director of General Education will be responsible for tracking whether FOK courses are offered at least once every two academic years. Courses that do not meet requirements will be subject to review and removal from the program.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board of Regents approve a revision to Constitution of the Northern Kentucky University Faculty Senate.

BACKGROUND:

Revisions to the Faculty Senate Constitution became necessary during the 2024-2025 academic year to reflect definitions of the “General Faculty,” including all full-time faculty ranks. Changes were also made to regulations of unit-level representation and at-large representation in the Faculty Senate.

The Faculty Senate approved the revisions on January 27, 2025.

CONSTITUTION OF THE FACULTY SENATE NORTHERN KENTUCKY UNIVERSITY

ARTICLE I. FUNCTIONS AND PURPOSES

- A. The Faculty Senate is the official representative body of the General Faculty of Northern Kentucky University.
- B. The purposes of the Faculty Senate are to:
 - 1) Provide a forum for the faculty to propose policy and to discuss all matters relating to the wellbeing of the University.
 - 2) Allow the faculty to participate effectively in the enactment of university policies.
 - 3) Conduct studies deemed essential to the progress of the University.
 - 4) Evaluate university policies, programs, and practices and recommend such improvements as seem warranted.
- C. As the representative of the General Faculty, the Senate shall be a counselor to the University president in matters of faculty concern. When the University president disagrees with a recommendation of the Senate, the Senate may be requested to reconsider its decision at its next regular meeting or at a special meeting called for that purpose. The University president or designee shall provide the Senate with the reasons for the disagreement. The Senate shall reconsider its decision, giving due weight to the University president's reasons. If the Senate and University president cannot agree, the University President, at the request of the Senate, shall report the Senate's views to the Board of Regents.

ARTICLE II. POWERS

- A. The General Faculty assembled in meeting has all powers necessary to implement the functions enumerated in ARTICLE I.
- B. All powers of the General Faculty are exercised through the Faculty Senate, except as limited by ARTICLE VIII, B and H.

ARTICLE III. MEMBERSHIP

- A. The General Faculty shall consist of all Tenured and Tenure-track faculty, and full-time, non-tenure track renewable faculty (e.g., Teaching, Clinical, Professors of Practice). Full-time librarians employed in faculty positions are part of the General Faculty.
- B. For the purpose of election to and service on the Faculty Senate, faculty is defined as

General Faculty who spend 25% or less of their time in an administrative appointment and who have held a faculty appointment for at least one academic year before assuming a Senate seat.

- C. All questions of eligibility for the Senate membership shall be resolved by the Executive Committee of the Faculty Senate.

ARTICLE IV. ELECTION OF MEMBERS

- A. All members of the General Faculty are eligible to vote in Faculty Senate elections.
- B. Members of the Faculty Senate shall be elected as follows:
 - 1) **Definitions.** “Unit” is defined as all academic subdivisions with full-time faculty members below the level of college OR not given the status of college in Article IV. Section B-2. (e.g., Learning Plus, Honors, First-Year Programs).
 - 2) The Senate consists of representatives from each academic unit below the level of college and at-large representatives from each college. For election purposes, all units not granting degrees (e.g., Learning PLUS, First-Year Programs, Honors, School-Based Scholars, Young Scholars Academy) shall be considered a single unit not affiliated with a college. The Steely Library faculty shall be given the same status as a college for voting purposes. The College of Law, including the Law Library, shall be entitled to one representative Senator. Graduate Programs shall be entitled to one Senator. Only full-time faculty who have taught at least one graduate course in the preceding two semesters are eligible to serve as the Graduate Programs representative.
 - 3) **Unit-level representatives.** Each unit will have a minimum of one elected representative to the Faculty Senate. When the number of full-time faculty members in the unit is greater than or equal to 25, the unit’s faculty will be permitted to elect additional representatives to ensure diverse representation across the larger unit. Units requesting additional representatives must notify the President of the Faculty Senate by April 30th prior to election of representative/s for the next academic year. The following table and formula shall be used to determine minimum and maximum unit-level representatives.

Unit size (full-time faculty)	Minimum number of elected Senators	Maximum number of elected Senators
0-24	1	1
25-34	1	2
35-44	1	3
45-54	1	4

- 4) **At-large representation.** The number of at-large representatives for an academic college will be based on the total number of full-time Tenured, Tenure-track, and Teaching faculty in the college. There will be one at-large representative for every 35 faculty members unless the total number of faculty is less than 35. In that case, the college will have one at-large

representative.

- 5) Unit-level representatives shall be elected by the faculty of that unit prior to the first meeting of a new academic year.
- 6) The Graduate Programs representative shall be chosen by a vote of the graduate faculty in an election conducted by the Graduate Council prior to the first meeting of a new academic year.
- 7) Election of all other faculty Senators shall be presided over by the Elections Committee of the Faculty Senate.
- 8) All Senators shall serve for two-year terms, with approximately one-half being elected each year. The term of office shall run from Aug. 15th through Aug. 14th of the following year.
- 9) One may not serve concurrently as both an at-large Senator and as a representative Senator.
- 10) By no later than the twelfth week of the Fall semester, the Elections Committee shall provide all eligible faculty members with ballots listing those faculty members within their college who, in writing, have consented to stand for election to the Faculty Senate as an at-large Senator. Each eligible faculty member may vote for as many candidates as there are available seats in their college. The Elections Committee shall tabulate the ballots and submit the results to the Faculty Senate by the December meeting of the Faculty Senate.
- 11) Vacancies
 - a) Vacancies of one semester or more in academic units shall be filled by a vote of the respective faculty. Notification of the results shall be made in writing to the president of the Faculty Senate.
 - b) Vacancies of one semester or more in at-large Senators shall be filled from the election results of the most recent election of that respective constituency. In case of a tie, the selection shall be by a coin flip conducted by the Chair of the Elections Committee in the presence of the tied candidates. If no candidates are available from that constituency, the position shall remain vacant until the next regular election.
 - c) Vacancies of less than one semester shall be filled by the absent Senator appointing an alternate with consultation of the President of the Faculty Senate. This alternate must be a full-time faculty member from the same constituency the absent Senator was elected to represent.

ARTICLE V. OFFICERS

- A. The Officers of the Faculty Senate shall be the President, Vice President, Secretary, Faculty Advocate, and the Chairpersons of all standing committees elected as provided herein. The Vice President shall serve as presiding officer in the absence of the President.

- B. *Ex Officio*, non-voting Officers of the Faculty Senate shall be the Faculty Regent, Parliamentarian, and Chairperson of the Graduate Council. As an officer elected by the General Faculty, the Faculty Advocate, if not elected as a Faculty Senator, shall have a vote in the Senate.
- C. The Officers of the Faculty Senate shall serve in their respective positions as the officers of the General Faculty.
- D. Officers serve at the pleasure of the Faculty Senate. An officer may be removed by a two-thirds vote of Senators present and voting. Any vacancy created by the removal or resignation of an officer should be filled by special election of the Faculty Senate.
- E. The President of the Faculty Senate shall serve as the Grand Marshall of the University. The Chase College of Law selects its own Grand Marshall.
- F. The President of the Faculty Senate, upon assumption of office, shall serve as representative of the General Faculty to the Senate. The unit, or college membership vacancy created shall be filled in accordance with Article IV, section B.

ARTICLE VI. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

- A. Before the first meeting of the Spring Semester, the incumbent President of the Faculty Senate shall call a special session with the sole purpose to elect Faculty Senate officers, except the Faculty Advocate, for the next session beginning on July 1. All Senators serving in the next session, including newly elected Senators and those whose terms do not expire at the end of the current Senate session are eligible to vote. The Elections Committee will conduct and preside over the election. Nominations may be submitted to the incumbent President of the Faculty Senate prior to the special meeting or may be made from the floor during the meeting. Terms of office shall be for one year. Officers must meet the Senate membership requirements as specified in Article III but do not have to be Senators.
- B. During the Spring Semester and before the final meeting of the Senate, the Elections Committee shall conduct an election of the General Faculty to choose the Faculty Advocate for the following year. The Elections Committee shall issue a call for nominations at least one month before the election. All full-time, tenured faculty are eligible to run for the position of Faculty Advocate.

ARTICLE VII. COMMITTEES

There shall be seven standing committees of the Faculty Senate: the Executive Committee; the Budget Committee; the University Curriculum Committee; the Faculty Benefits Committee; the Teaching Enhancement and Effectiveness Committee; the Professional Concerns Committee; and the General Education Committee.

- A. The Budget Committee, University Curriculum Committee, Faculty Benefits Committee, and Professional Concerns Committee include one representative from each academic unit elected by the faculty of that unit. Committees may, upon approval of the Executive Committee, request additional representatives. Requests must be made no later than April 30th of the preceding academic year.

- B. The General Education Committee (GEC) and The Teaching Effectiveness and Enhancement Committee (TEEC) membership are chosen according to their respective bylaws and approved by the Faculty Senate Executive Committee. At a minimum, there will be at least one member from each College.
- C. The Executive Committee shall consist of the officers of the Faculty Senate, including *ex officio* officers, and it shall be chaired by the President of Faculty Senate.

Reassigned time or stipends shall be allotted to the following members of the Executive Committee:

President – 50% reassigned time

Faculty Benefits Committee Chair – 25% reassigned time

Professional Concerns Committee Chair – 25%reassigned time

Budget Committee Chair – 25% reassigned time

General Education Committee Chair – 25% reassigned time

Teaching Enhancement and Effectiveness Committee Chair – 25% reassigned time

University Curriculum Committee Chair – 25% reassigned time

Faculty Advocate – 25% reassigned time

Vice President – stipend (amount set by Provost) Secretary – stipend (amount set by Provost) Parliamentarian – stipend (amount set by Provost)

D. The following duties shall be the specific responsibilities of the Executive Committee:

- 1) It shall function as the official representative body of the faculty when the Faculty Senate is not in session and may take whatever emergency action it deems necessary. Such action shall be presented for approval to the Faculty Senate at its next regular meeting.
- 2) It shall cause matters approved by the Faculty Senate to be conveyed to the president of the University for appropriate action, and shall report the action taken to the Faculty Senate.
- 3) It shall serve as a committee on committees to work with the administration in forming university committees and in appointing their membership when appropriate.
- 4) It shall receive the written and/or oral reports of the committees of the Faculty Senate.
- 5) It shall refer such matters as are designated by the Faculty Senate for action by the appropriate committee.
- 6) It shall prepare the agenda for meetings of the Faculty Senate. Committee recommendations intended for Senate action shall be so designated on the

agenda.

- 7) It shall insure that nominations and elections are carried out as specified in the Constitution.

E. The following duties shall be the specific responsibility of the Budget Committee:

- 1) It shall review, analyze, receive updates on, recommend and report to the Faculty Senate on all matters pertaining to the budget, including the following:
 - a) The Council on Postsecondary Education's (CPE) biennial budget development process and the University's input into it, including the CPE's capital and operating recommendations for funding NKU and each of the public institutions.
 - b) The University's annual operating budget in at least the preliminary, intermediate and final stages of its development.
 - c) Salary data relating to the university salary policy and appointment.
 - d) Major capital expenditure proposals submitted by the administration.
- 2) It shall serve as an advisory board to the Executive Committee and our representative to the Coalition of Faculty Senate Leadership (COSFL) to ensure that faculty interests are represented by COSFL at the state level.

F. The following duties shall be the specific responsibility of the University Curriculum Committee.

- 1) It shall make recommendations to the Faculty Senate, and through it to the University administration, in all areas of curriculum policies and procedures and curriculum-related definitions with the exception of those policies and procedures that fall under the purview of the Chase College of Law.
- 2) It shall periodically review, evaluate, and make recommendations concerning such policies and procedures. In examining proposals it shall apply criteria including pedagogy, academic quality, staffing, and available resources.
- 3) Recommendations of the University Curriculum Committee do not require full Faculty Senate approval except for changes to the general education program (including new general education courses), new programs, substantive program changes and changes to the UCC bylaws. No curriculum changes may be made without approval by the regular curriculum process.

G. The following duties shall be the specific responsibility of the Faculty Benefits Committee:

- 1) It shall review, evaluate, and make recommendations concerning those policies, procedures, and programs related to faculty benefits; such as those policies dealing with insurance, retirement, salary schedules, academic leaves, summer fellowships, institutional project grants, deferred compensation, the credit union, travel allowance, and reassigned time.
- 2) It shall process applications of and make recommendation on candidates for Faculty Sabbatical Leaves, Faculty Project Grants, Faculty Summer Fellowships

and other programs assigned by the Faculty Senate.

H. The following duties shall be the specific responsibility of the General Education Committee:

1) It shall review, evaluate, and recommend General Education policies, including oversight, revisions to, and assessment of the General Education Program.

I. The following duties shall be the specific responsibility of the Professional Concern Committee:

1) It shall provide a forum for the faculty to propose policy and to discuss all matters relating to the wellbeing of the University.

2) It shall review, evaluate, and make recommendations concerning policies relating to the general academic and professional concerns of the faculty, both full and part-time.

3) It shall review, evaluate, and make recommendations regarding all policies procedures and practices related to governance of the university.

J. The following duties shall be the specific responsibility of the Teaching Enhancement and Effectiveness Committee:

1) It shall review, evaluate, and recommend policies regarding the evaluation and enhancement of teaching.

2) It shall review, evaluate, and recommend student policies regarding all matters of concern to the faculty.

K. Elections Committee

1) No later than September 20 of each year, the president of the Faculty Senate shall appoint a member of the general faculty from each college offering degrees to constitute an Elections Committee.

2) Members of the Election Committee may not be candidates for election to the Faculty Senate.

3) The Elections Committee shall preside over all elections sponsored by the Faculty Senate.

ARTICLE VIII. FACULTY ADVOCATE

A. The following duties shall be the specific responsibility of the Faculty Advocate:

1) Provide assistance in resolving faculty complaints and concerns. Consultations with the Faculty Advocate when providing this assistance is not a breach of confidentiality for the faculty member or Faculty Advocate.

2) Consult with faculty from each department and school on campus throughout the year in order to better understand faculty concerns. These consultations shall remain confidential unless faculty agree to waive confidentiality.

3) Make policy recommendations to the Executive Committee as appropriate, while at all times maintaining the confidentiality of interactions with individual faculty, unless faculty agree to waive confidentiality.

4) Meet with appropriate administrators as needed.

ARTICLE IX. MEETINGS

A. The General Faculty shall meet as appropriate; the meeting to be convened by the President of the Faculty Senate, the President of the University, the Provost, or the Executive Committee of the Faculty Senate.

Should a petition, signed by at least 10 percent of the General Faculty as exhibited on the official roster, requesting a meeting of the General Faculty and indicating proposed items of business be filed with the President of the Faculty Senate, the Executive Committee shall call a meeting of the General Faculty to consider those matters. Such a meeting shall be held not later than fourteen calendar days, exclusive of holidays, from the filing date of the petition. The filing of a petition challenging Senate action shall be interpreted as a declaration that the General Faculty is asserting its jurisdiction.

B. No meeting of the General Faculty called by the Executive Committee shall be held unless an agenda prepared by that committee is distributed to all members of the General Faculty at least five business days prior to the meeting date.

C. The Faculty Senate shall meet at least once each month during the academic year, unless deemed unnecessary by the Executive Committee. Special meetings may be called at any time during the course of the year, including the summer, by the President of the Faculty Senate or its Executive Committee. Regular meetings shall ordinarily be on the fourth Monday of each month; emergency changes of date may be made by the Executive Committee.

D. The Executive Committee shall appoint a temporary chairperson should neither the President nor the Vice-president be in attendance.

E. All meetings of the Faculty Senate shall be open to the University community. Any member of the General Faculty present shall receive floor privileges upon request; however, these privileges shall not include the right to introduce or second motions or to vote. Other members of the academic community may be granted floor privileges with the same restrictions by a majority vote of the Senate. Only duly elected senators or their designated alternates in attendance may introduce or second motions or vote.

F. Agenda items and supporting information shall be submitted to the Executive Committee at least fourteen calendar days prior to the scheduled Senate meeting. Items may also be placed on the agenda by the Executive Committee on its own motion or by any member of the Senate, or by petition signed by at least ten members of the General Faculty at least five business days in advance of the Faculty Senate meetings.

G. Minutes of the previous meeting of the Faculty Senate and an agenda for the next meeting shall be distributed to all members of the Faculty Senate at least five business days prior to the subsequent Senate meeting. A second copy shall be sent to each senator for posting and review by all faculty. Actions of the Faculty Senate shall

become final fourteen calendar days, exclusive of holidays, following the official distribution of said minutes, unless the General Faculty asserts its jurisdiction.

ARTICLE X. FACULTY REGENT

The Faculty Regent shall report regularly to the Faculty Senate, and through it to the General Faculty, on those matters, which are coming before the Board of Regents and shall report action taken on such matters.

ARTICLE XI. RULES OF ORDER

A majority vote is defined as a majority of those present and voting. An abstention shall not count as a vote. In the absence of any other special rules of order, which the General Faculty or the Faculty Senate may adopt, Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised (latest edition) shall govern the conduct of the meetings.

ARTICLE XII. QUORUM

A quorum for a Faculty Senate meeting shall be 50 percent of its members.

ARTICLE XIII. STANDING COMMITTEE'S BYLAWS

Each standing committee shall maintain its own bylaws. All amendments are subject to the approval of Faculty Senate.

ARTICLE XIV. SEVERABILITY

The invalidation of any portion of this constitution shall not affect the validity of any other portion of the constitution.

ARTICLE XV. EFFECTIVE DATE

This constitution becomes effective upon approval by the Board of Regents and becomes part of the Faculty Policies and Procedures Handbook.

ARTICLE XVI. AMENDMENTS

This constitution may be amended at any meeting of the General Faculty by a two-thirds majority of those present and voting, provided the proposed amendment was included in the agenda and was available to the members of the General Faculty for one week prior to the meeting. The approved amendment becomes operative upon ratification by the Board of Regents.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board of Regents approve a revision to Chase College of Law Faculty Handbook.

BACKGROUND:

Standard 208, adopted by the American Bar Association (ABA) in February 2024, required that law schools comply with significant policies that subsequently mandated changes to the Chase College of Law Faculty Handbook. The law school adopted and/or reaffirmed policies, including:

1. *NKU Faculty Handbook Sections 1, 14, and 16;*
2. *Chase College of Law Faculty Handbook Section 15;*
3. *NKU Free Expression Policy (2007) Sections I and II;*
4. *NKU Community Standards & Student Rights (2022);*
5. *NKU HYB-ETHICS-VALUES Policy (2022).*

Additional details are contained in the attached memorandum.

The Chase College of Law faculty approved this change on March 13, 2025.

This memorandum summarizes the status of ABA Standard 208 compliance at NKU Chase College of Law and proposes a policy for Chase to adopt to fully meet Standard 208's requirements.

I. Summary of ABA Standard 208

As adopted by the ABA in February 2024, Standard 208 requires that law schools implement two significant policies.¹ First, a law school must explicitly protect academic freedom. Faculty and other instructors who believe administrative decisions adversely impact their academic freedom must be afforded due process. Second, a law school must explicitly protect free expression, while also ensuring that its activities will be free from disruption.

A Managing Director's Guidance Memo issued by the ABA in September of 2024 provides significant instruction on the interpretation and implementation of Standard 208. For one, the guidance memo makes clear that law schools may satisfy Standard 208 by simply readopting or reaffirming policies already in place at their universities. The memo also advises that law schools may satisfy the rule by cobbling together a variety of different policies and provisions rather than issuing one new free speech policy. As the memo highlights, Standard 208 also gives law schools significant flexibility in imposing time, place, and manner restrictions on speech to protect educational environments and in restricting unprotected expression. Standard 208 permits general policy statements and requires no specific language or rule.

Additional guidance released by the ABA instructs that law schools must be Standard 208-compliant by summer 2025.²

II. Summary of Library Committee's Standard 208 Process

To ensure Chase's compliance with Standard 208, the Library Committee began work on the issue during the 2023-2024 academic year. That work has continued to this academic year. During AY 23-24, the Committee focused on gathering internal information by surveying our own landscape and considering input from key stakeholder communities (faculty, students, university). The AY 24-25 work has been more external, enabling us to observe the Standard 208 landscape that has taken shape at law schools across the country.

A. AY 2023-2024

During the 2023-2024 academic year, the Library Committee engaged in extensive research, investigation, and stakeholder outreach regarding the implementation of ABA Standard 208 at Chase College of Law. The Committee met several times to review and discuss the Standard itself, as well as to discuss historical events at NKU that may suggest a need for sensitivity in developing Chase's Standard 208 language. We solicited input from our colleagues on the faculty and from the student body through targeted emails and announcements at SBA events. We connected with outside organizations in the campus free speech space. And we researched existing policies already in place both at the law school and at NKU generally that might either support or conflict with what Standard 208 requires, both in terms of the Standard's substantive and procedural dimensions.

To that end, the Committee collected and reviewed significant documentation, including:

- 1) A written summary from the student committee member of feedback from the student body in response to both written and oral requests for student input;
- 2) Information from FIRE (the Foundation for Individual Rights in Education) on Standard 208 policy development; and
- 3) Existing policies at NKU and Chase College of Law that overlap with Standard 208's requirements.

B. AY 2024-2025

During the 2024-2025 academic year, the Committee elected to monitor the development of Standard 208 policies at other law schools. To that end, AALS has developed a Standard 208 clearinghouse webpage with information for law school deans and other administrators tasked with ensuring Standard 208 compliance.³

All of the law schools featured on the clearinghouse website — which include both public and private institutions — have elected to satisfy Standard 208 by adopting policies already in place at their universities. None of the highlighted schools have written law school-specific policies in response to Standard 208.

III. NKU and Chase's Existing Academic Freedom and Free Expression Policies Largely Satisfy ABA Standard 208

Given the trend at other law schools to satisfy Standard 208 by reference to university-wide policies already in effect, we surveyed NKU's existing academic freedom and free expression policies to determine their compliance with Standard 208. The attached chart⁴ compares the key components to existing policies already in effect at NKU and Chase. While there is certainly room

to improve the language, letter, and spirit of NKU’s speech-related policies, from a Standard 208 standpoint, the existing policies largely comport with what the ABA requires of Chase.

With regard to Standard 208’s free expression requirements, NKU’s existing policies are fully compliant with the Standard. NKU’s 2007 Free Expression Policy contains a general commitment statement to free speech principles and permits free speech activities, subject to limitations that avoid disruption.⁵ NKU’s 2022 Community Standards & Student Rights Policy also protects free speech while prohibiting disruption, harassment, and bullying, and provides significant process to separate the two.⁶

The 2007 policy, however, was written before the Supreme Court’s decisions in *Reed v. Town of Gilbert*, 576 U.S. 155 (2015), and *City of Austin v. Reagan Nat’l Adver. of Austin, LLC*, 596 U.S. 61 (2022), which discuss the concept of content-based restrictions on signage. The 2007 policy may be vulnerable to challenges based on those decisions. Thus, the Committee recommends excluding the signage portion of the 2007 policy from its Standard 208 package to avoid any issues in that regard.

With regard to Standard 208’s academic freedom requirements, NKU’s existing policies are mostly compliant. The NKU faculty handbook explicitly protects academic freedom, and both the NKU and Chase faculty handbooks, which apply to a range of employed instructors, provide a grievance and complaint process for those adversely affected by decisions that bear on academic freedom.⁷ NKU’s more general values and ethics policy also protects academic freedom for all members of NKU’s community.⁸

Where there is a small gap between Standard 208 and NKU’s policies, however, is in the due process required for decisions adversely impacting academic freedom. Standard 208(a)(3) requires that due process be afforded any person whose academic freedom is negatively impacted. The September 2024 guidance memo makes clear that this includes not only full-time, part-time, and adjunct faculty, but also guest lecturers, speakers, and teaching assistants. Nothing in NKU’s existing policies provides due process to the latter individuals when their academic freedom is at stake. Thus, to be fully compliant with Standard 208, Chase must adopt a due process policy for these individuals.

IV. Recommended Chase Standard 208 Policy

To ensure that Chase is fully compliant with Standard 208, both by reaffirming existing NKU policies and by filling the due process gap that exists for temporary instructors, we recommend that the law school adopt the following proposal:

NKU Chase College of Law supports the principles of free expression and academic freedom for all members of its community. Both NKU and Chase College of Law currently follow a number of policies and procedures designed to guarantee these important freedoms on their campuses. To ensure its commitment to these important constitutional protections, as relevant to Standard 208 only, Chase College of Law formally readopts, where formerly applicable; adopts, where not formerly applicable; and agrees to implement on or before July 1, 2025 and/or, for policies already in effect, continue to implement the following policies and procedures:

- 1. NKU Faculty Handbook Sections 1, 14, and 16;*
- 2. Chase College of Law Faculty Handbook Section 15;*
- 3. NKU Free Expression Policy (2007) Sections I and II;*
- 4. NKU Community Standards & Student Rights (2022);*
- 5. NKU HYB-ETHICS-VALUES Policy (2022).*

In addition, Chase College of Law adopts and agrees to implement on or before July 1, 2025 the following policy:

Where a non-faculty member who provides instruction or enrichment to students on behalf of NKU Chase College of Law (i.e., a guest lecturer, speaker, or teaching assistant) has cause to believe that an adverse decision has been made against the non-faculty member on the basis of conduct that is protected by academic freedom, the non-faculty member may appeal by submitting a complaint in writing to the Associate Dean for Academics within 14 days of the adverse decision. The non-faculty member may submit additional information to be considered by the Associate Dean for Academics along with the complaint. The Associate Dean for Academics shall resolve the complaint in writing within 30 days of its submission. Decisions by the Associate Dean of Academics on complaints submitted pursuant to this policy shall be final.

RECOMMENDATION:

Recommend the Board of Regents approve the full revision of the Student Government Constitution

BACKGROUND:

During the 2024-25 academic year, members of the Student Government (Chief Justice Tommy Holtz, President Lucy Burns, and Vice President Collin Jarrell) created a committee to undertake a full revision of the Constitution of the Student Government Association. The new Constitutional changes were thoroughly reviewed internally and then presented to the Student Senate for recommendations and the proposal to begin the Amendment Process. The committee then met with the President of the University, Dr. Cady Short-Thompson, and received her critiques, thoughts, and recommendations. Then, following final revisions, the new Constitution passed the Senate and in the Student Body Election.

The framework of the current Student Government Constitution, which hasn't seen any updates since 2019, was in need of revision to improve clarity and reflect current organizational needs. Many powers, responsibilities, and processes were scattered throughout the document, making it difficult for members to navigate and consistently interpret their roles and duties. Over time, this led to inefficiencies, inconsistencies in decision-making, and challenges in holding members accountable. Additionally, outdated language and vague provisions no longer align with the evolving structure and goals of SGA. The revision process aimed to consolidate related sections, clarify procedural steps, and introduce a more transparent and accessible format. These changes were essential to ensure the Constitution remains a functional and relevant guiding document for both current leaders and future student representatives.

A summary of the changes is as follows:

The Articles were restructured to better organize the document to allow readers to better know where to look for information. In the interest of being concise, several shorter articles such as Article I Functions, Article II Definitions, and Article III Membership and Qualifications were re-worked to be included in Articles I-III of the New Constitution under their pertinent branches of government.

Legislative Branch:

The Structure of the Senate will be altered to have College Representation. Each of the five colleges will have three senators representing them with five seats reserved for first-year students, and ten at-large seats for other senators. This is intended to create a more balanced and inclusive Senate, ensuring that each academic college has a consistent voice in student government. By strengthening representation across all areas of the university, the new structure aims to improve communication, advocacy, and responsiveness to student needs.

A new position will be added in the Senate. A Speaker of the Senate will act as the leader of the Senate. They will chair Legislative Sessions and assist in ensuring that legislation is properly formatted.

The Legislative Process was slightly altered to streamline and unentangle the process.

Executive Branch:

The Chief of Staff position will be dissolved and their responsibilities will be delegated to the Vice President. The Chief of Staff position was a highly specialized role that did not require its own position to solely execute and would better suit as one of the responsibilities of the Vice President.

The Secretaries will now no longer be an elected position and instead will be by appointment as it benefits the overall efficiency and cohesion of the Executive Branch if the president can choose their preferred cabinet.

Judicial Branch:

The Justices will no longer be an elected position and instead will be appointed for the duration of their tenure in SGA. This will allow for the Justices to run the elections of the SGA. Being appointed without having to be reelected or reappointed will also align more with other SGAs from other universities across Kentucky.

Miscellaneous Adjustments:

The Amendments will no longer cause any adjustments to be made to the document and instead will be listed separately. Similar to how the United States Constitution lists their amendments separately.

The Constitution of the
Student Government Association of
Northern Kentucky University

Preamble

We the students of Northern Kentucky University, in recognizing our rights as members of the University; to promote collegial governance and relations between the Board of Regents, Administration, Faculty, Staff, and the Student Body; and to form a legitimate body to serve as the voice of the students for the betterment of Northern Kentucky University; do hereby establish the Student Government Association of Northern Kentucky University.

Article I: Legislative Branch

Section 1: Structure

- A. The Student Senate shall consist of a maximum of thirty Senators with three Senators serving as Senate Committee Chairs and one Senator serving as the Speaker of the Senate
- B. Each of the following colleges shall have three senators to represent them, for a total of fifteen College Senators:
 - a. The College of Arts and Sciences, The Haile College of Business, The College of Education, The College of Health and Human Services, and The College of Informatics
- C. The remaining fifteen Senators shall be considered “At Large”
 - a. At Large Senators shall represent the student body as a whole with no assignment to a particular college
 - b. Ten At Large Senators shall be elected in the Spring
 - c. Five At Large Senate seats shall be reserved for students in their first semester at Northern Kentucky University (NKU) following completion of high school or after earning their General Education Diploma and shall be elected during the fall semester

Section 2: Senate Qualifications, Terms of Office, Powers, and Duties

- A. Qualifications for the Student Senate:
 - a. Must be an enrolled student at NKU and in good standing as defined by the University
 - b. Must receive a cumulative college GPA of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale at the time of their election or appointment and maintain a semester GPA of 2.0 and a cumulative GPA of 2.5 for the duration of their term
- B. Terms of Office
 - a. Student Senators elected in the Spring Elections shall be obligated to serve a one-year term ending at the conclusion of the following Spring Election
 - b. Student Senators who are appointed throughout the academic year or elected in the Fall Election shall be obligated to serve until the conclusion of the next Spring Election
- C. Powers
 - a. The Student Senate shall have the power to draft, discuss, and pass legislation
 - b. Senators shall have the power to serve on University Committees at the appointment of the President
- D. Duties of the Student Senate
 - a. Shall attend all regularly scheduled meetings of the Student Government Association

- b. Shall serve on an SGA Student Senate Committee as recommended by the Vice President to the President, and a University standing committee at the additional recommendation of the President
- c. Shall be obligated to serve one office hour per week at the discretion of the President

Section 3: Meetings

- A. Meetings of the Student Government Association will occur every week of the academic year when Fall or Spring full-term classes are in session
 - a. Regularly scheduled meetings disrupted by University closures are not required to be rescheduled
- B. The Meetings shall comprise two stages with the first stage being the General Body Session and the second stage being the Legislative Session
- C. Upon the conclusion of the General Body Session, a motion shall be made to start the Legislative Session
- D. All meetings of the Student Government shall be subject to the most current version of Robert's Rules of Order wherein the President shall serve as the chair of the General Body Session and the Speaker shall serve as the chair of the Legislative Session
- E. The primary purpose of the General Body Session shall be the communication of relevant information within the Student Government Association
- F. The primary purpose of the Legislative Session shall be the presentation, review, and passage of legislation for the benefit of the Student Body of Northern Kentucky University
 - a. All members of the Student Senate shall be eligible to vote on all legislation or other business presented to the body
 - b. In the event of a tie, the legislation will be tabled until the following meeting
- G. All meetings of the Student Government shall be subject to follow the Order of Meeting as laid out in the weekly Agenda distributed by the Secretary of Administration or their designee
- H. The Executive Branch, Chief Justice, and Committee Chairs shall be obligated to give reports to the Body on their current tasks, projects, or other Student Government business
- I. Senators may also give reports on their legislation or research if acknowledged by the Chair
- J. A quorum must be met in order to pass legislation at a Legislative Session
 - a. A minimum number of members of the Student Senate is not necessary to pass legislation, only a quorum must be met
 - b. Quorum is defined as one-half of the current number of Student Senate members plus one
- K. The Student Senate shall be considered on recess when either Fall or Spring full-term classes are not in session

Section 4: Senate Committees

- A. All Senate Committees shall be responsible for addressing concerns of the student body relevant to their area of focus
- B. Standing Committees shall be permanently established and shall be subject to review of their relevance to Student Senate operations at the discretion of the President
 - a. Student Advocacy
 - b. University Improvements
 - c. Academic Excellence
- C. Additional, temporary, Senate committees may be established to address emergent concerns of the Student Body and shall be disbanded at the conclusion of the current academic year or at the discretion of the Committee Chair and the President
- D. Each Student Senate Committee, both standing and temporary, shall receive an appointed Chair to serve as a head of committee operations
- E. Senators shall be assigned to Committees at the discretion of the Vice President and the confirmation of the President
 - a. Senators shall be subject to committee reassignment at the discretion of the Vice President and the confirmation of the President

Section 5: Speaker of the Senate

- A. Shall serve as the Chair for Legislative Sessions
- B. Shall be elected by the Senate from the current pool of Senators once the Senate reaches ten Senators
 - a. Shall serve a term that will expire upon the conclusion of the semester they were elected in
 - b. Speakers may be reelected upon the conclusion of their term
 - c. The President shall serve as the chair of legislative sessions until a Speaker is elected
- C. Shall coordinate with the Vice President to format completed legislation in an appropriate manner
- D. Shall receive a stipend per semester

Section 6: Committee Chairs

- A. Shall be recommended for appointment from the Vice President to the President, and shall be confirmed by a majority vote of the Senate
- B. Shall be responsible for overseeing all actions of the committee including the drafting and passage of legislation
- C. Shall be responsible for ensuring the productivity of the committee
- D. Shall serve as a liaison to the General Body and the Executive Board to report on Committee Activity
 - a. Shall not be considered a member of the Executive Cabinet in any decision-making capacity, and shall retain all duties and powers of a Senator
- E. Shall be obligated to host one event per semester relevant to the operation of their committee

F. Shall receive a stipend per semester

Section 7: Legislative Process

A. Legislation Definitions

- a. A Resolution is a piece of legislation from the Student Senate to the University Administration that contains a call to action
 - i. Approvals of University Policy may take the form of a Resolution, following a modified legislative process
- b. An Honorary Resolution is a piece of legislation drafted by the Student Senate to recognize an individual or organization for their actions
- c. A Proclamation is drafted by a Senator with the intention of requesting action or a use of powers by a member of the Executive Cabinet
 - i. The member of the Cabinet called upon is not obligated to act under the language of the Proclamation

B. Legislative Process

- a. A Senator may start the Legislative Process based on any idea they deem necessary for a Resolution or an Honorary Resolution
 - i. Any legislation shall be subject to review and approval by the Chair of that Senator's respective Committee
- b. If the legislation is approved in committee, the piece of legislation shall be officially listed as "business" and the sponsoring senator shall begin drafting the legislation
- c. The legislation shall be discussed and drafted in committee
- d. The completed legislation must be given to the Vice President and Speaker of the Senate for grammatical review, then to the Secretary of Administration to be placed on the Agenda for a first reading at the next meeting of the Student Government Association
- e. Following the first reading the legislation shall be placed on the Agenda for the next meeting of the Student Government Association for a second reading
- f. Following the second reading, a vote may be called for by any member of the Student Senate
 - i. To pass, legislation must receive a majority vote of the Student Senate, upon a tie, the Chair may vote to break the tie
- g. Following the passage the Speaker and Sponsoring Senator must sign and send the legislation to the President

C. Presidential Review

- a. Upon the passage of legislation, the President may sign or veto the legislation. When a veto occurs the Senate may override the veto by a supermajority vote
 - i. A supermajority vote is a two-thirds majority vote of the Senate
- b. When the legislation is signed by the President it is then considered enacted and the Legislative Process completed

- c. Following the completion of the Legislative Process, the legislation shall be distributed to the necessary University stakeholders for implementation
- D. Legislative Process Exemptions
 - a. Proclamations do not require Committee Approval to begin the Legislative Process and may be presented at any time during the meeting with acknowledgment from the Chair
 - b. Approving University Policy
 - i. University Policy proposals submitted to the SGA may be reviewed by the appropriate committee, and commented upon by the general body
 - ii. Any suggestions or revisions to the proposed policy may be communicated back to the appropriate University stakeholders
 - iii. A final approval of the University Policy shall be made in the form of a Resolution and voted on by the Student Senate

Section 8: Vacancies in the Legislative Branch

A. Senator Vacancies

- a. If a vacancy occurs in the Senate, the President may appoint an eligible student to fill the position, or applications may be accepted on a rolling basis until the position is filled
 - i. All applicants may be subject to an interview and subsequent appointment by the President
- b. All appointees shall be subject to a confirmation vote of the Student Senate before assuming office
- c. All vacancies shall be filled as they occur, until the conclusion of the week of Spring midterms, at which time the President may continue to fill vacancies at their discretion, but is not required to do so
 - i. Following the Conclusion of the Spring Election, should any vacancies be present in the seats reserved for the Colleges, those seats may be filled with:
 - 1. Current At Large Senators who are a member of that college, and will no longer be considered At Large upon a Senate confirmation vote
 - 2. Applicants who are a member of that college and who are confirmed by the Senate through the Vacancy Process

B. Committee Chair Vacancies

- a. If a Committee Chair resigns, is unable to perform their duties, or is removed from their position following an impeachment, a new Committee Chair shall be appointed
- b. Applications for Committee Chair may be accepted at the discretion of the Vice President, but are not required

C. Speaker of the Senate Vacancy

- a. If a Speaker resigns, is unable to perform their duties, or is removed from their position following an impeachment, a new Speaker shall be elected and shall serve the remainder of the semester

Article II: Executive Branch

Section 1: Structure

- A. The Executive Branch shall consist of the President and the Executive Cabinet
- B. The Executive Cabinet shall consist of the Vice President, Secretary of Administration, Secretary of Public Relations, and Secretary of Campus Involvement

Section 2: Executive Qualifications and Terms of Office

- A. Qualifications for the President:
 - a. Must be enrolled as a full-time student in good standing as defined by the University and must maintain a cumulative 2.75 GPA and a semester GPA of 2.0 throughout their term of office
 - b. Must fulfill the requirements to serve as a Student Regent
- B. Qualifications for the Executive Cabinet:
 - a. Must be a full-time student at NKU, as defined by the University, during the term of office
 - b. Must have completed thirty credit hours by the beginning of the fall semester following their election, receive a cumulative GPA of at least 0.25 above the Student Senate GPA requirement, and maintain a semester GPA of 2.0
- C. Terms of Office
 - a. The President and Vice President shall serve a term that shall begin upon their swearing of the Oath of Office and concludes following the swearing-in of the new President and Vice President
 - b. Secretaries shall serve a term that begins upon their confirmation vote from the Senate and ends upon the swearing in of the new President unless they are removed by the current President or are no longer eligible or able to serve

Section 3: President

- A. Shall preside as Chair over General Body Sessions as well as all meetings of the Executive Cabinet
- B. Shall recommend, request, and organize any liaisons that may be deemed necessary or beneficial to the operations of the Student Government Meetings
- C. May communicate ideas, projects, or goals to the Student Senate for potential legislation
- D. May form ad-hoc committees to address specific tasks or goals
 - a. The Senate must confirm ad-hoc committees and its members by majority vote
- E. Shall recommend students for appointment to University standing committees through the SGA Advisors
- F. Shall review all legislation adopted by the Student Senate, and may veto or approve legislation, as deemed necessary

- a. Legislation approved by the President shall be verified by their signature. Failure to sign legislation within ten official school days of passage by the Student Senate constitutes a veto
 - b. Legislation vetoed by the President shall be returned to the Student Senate, accompanied by the veto message. A veto may be overridden by a supermajority of the Student Senate at the next Student Senate meeting
 - c. Following the signing, it shall be the duty of the President to communicate to and work toward implementation with the appropriate University stakeholders
- G. Shall create and retain up-to-date contacts with comparison institutions
 - H. Shall represent the student body on the Board of Regents, pursuant to KRS 164.321
 - I. Shall represent NKU on the Board of Student Body Presidents (BSBP)
 - J. Shall coordinate efforts with administration and necessary offices on issues facing Higher Education and the Student Body and shall manage advocacy efforts with the city of Highland Heights, Campbell County, and the Commonwealth of Kentucky
 - K. Shall enter into agreements with agencies and organizations inside and outside the University community. This shall be done on behalf of SGA subject to a majority approval of the Student Senate. If the Student Senate is in recess, a majority approval of the Executive Cabinet shall be used
 - L. Shall review the performance of the duties of the Secretaries and may request resignation or request the drafting of articles of impeachment if they are not fulfilling all obligations and duties of their office
 - M. May sign Executive Orders which shall be a written notice of the President enacting and internal policy for the duration of their term
 - a. No Executive Order shall violate or contradict this Constitution or its Bylaws
 - N. Shall be obligated to serve no more than twenty office hours per week during the academic year
 - O. Shall be offered on-campus housing and a meal-plan for the entirety of their term, not to be paid via the SGA budget, and shall be compensated for each of their mandatory hours

Section 4: Vice President

- A. Shall act in place of the President when they are absent, or at the request of the President
- B. Shall assume the duties of any Secretary should a vacancy occur
- C. Shall recommend Student Senate Committee Chairs to the President for appointment and approval by a majority of the Student Senate
- D. Shall recommend Student Senate members' committee assignment to the President
- E. Shall review completed legislation format, grammar, and organization
- F. Shall serve as the SGA representative at Faculty Senate and Staff Congress meetings. If unable to fulfill this duty, the Vice President may select a designee to serve in this capacity

- G. Shall coordinate both a fall and spring semester SGA retreat in conjunction with the Advisors. Shall also coordinate the SGA banquet, to be held at the conclusion of the spring semester
- H. Shall be responsible for the maintenance of the SGA Office and tracking and coordinating the implementation of passed resolutions
- I. Shall be obligated to serve no more than fifteen office hours per week during the academic year
- J. Shall be compensated for each of their mandatory hours

Section 5: Secretary of Administration

- A. Shall be appointed by the President-Elect following the Spring Election
- B. Shall provide Student Government Meeting agendas, coordinate office hours, and oversee the application process for all SGA appointments
- C. Shall compile, maintain, and archive, appropriate records of minutes, agendas, attendance, and voting
 - a. Shall ensure that the minutes of the previous meeting are received at least seventy-two hours prior to the next SGA meeting. All records shall be kept with the SGA Office
- D. Shall discuss and distribute the attendance policies for all SGA members, consult with the Advisors on the academic status of SGA members, and maintain the SGA budget in collaboration with the Office of the Dean of Students
- E. Shall receive a stipend per semester

Section 6: Secretary of Public Relations

- A. Shall be appointed by the President-Elect following the Spring Election
- B. The Secretary of Public Relations shall prepare and coordinate all external SGA publicity and related media, public relations efforts of all Student Senate committees, and assist in the publication of election notices and materials
- C. Shall receive a stipend per semester

Section 7: Secretary of Campus Involvement

- A. Shall be appointed by the President-Elect following the Spring Election
- B. Shall coordinate and facilitate communication with registered student organizations (RSOs) and serve as the official liaison with the Office of Student Engagement
- C. Shall chair and attend regularly scheduled meetings of the Travel Fund Committee and Programming Activities Grant Committee
- D. Shall meet with student representatives from areas of Campus Engagement
- E. Shall receive a stipend per semester

Section 8: Executive Cabinet Meetings

- A. The President shall meet with the Executive Cabinet on a regular basis and preside over the meeting
- B. Executive Cabinet Members shall give reports based on their area of focus

- C. The Chief Justice, Speaker of the Senate, and Committee Chairs may attend, serve as non-voting meeting members, and give reports

Section 9: Vacancies in the Executive Branch

A. Board of Regents Vacancy:

- a. If the President does not maintain their position as SGA President, a special election to select a full-time student member of the Board of Regents shall occur, pursuant to KRS 164.321(8)(a)
- b. This special election shall be held no later than twenty official school days after said vacancy
- c. The student elected shall fulfill the remainder of the Student Regent term of office but shall not assume the duties of the President of SGA unless the elected person is the current Vice President

B. Vacancy of President

- a. If a vacancy occurs in the Presidency, the Vice President shall assume the office of the President and appoint a Vice President, at their discretion
- b. A written letter of vacancy by the outgoing President should be provided
- c. If a letter cannot be provided, the Dean of Students may confirm the vacancy

C. Vacancy of both President and Vice President

- a. If both President and Vice President do not maintain their position within SGA, the Secretary of Administration shall serve as the chairperson of the Student Senate until such a time as a special election can be held for the office of President and Vice President
 - i. This special election shall not be later than twenty official school days after resignation or removal
 - ii. The candidate selected from the special election shall immediately assume the duties of the President
 - iii. Any candidate already holding a position running for a vacant position shall maintain their position if they do not win the special election

D. Vacancy in the Executive Cabinet

- a. If a vacancy other than the Presidency occurs in the Executive Cabinet, the President shall appoint an eligible student to fill the position
- b. The appointee/s shall appear before the Student Senate for a confirmation vote and receive a supermajority vote of the Student Senate to confirm their appointment
- c. Fully confirmed members shall serve the remainder of the term until the next Spring Election

Section 10: Line of Succession

A. Following a vacancy of the President and Vice President the Line of Succession for Chair of the General Body Session shall be as follows:

- a. Secretary of Administration
- b. Secretary of Campus Involvement
- c. Secretary of Public Relations
- d. Chair of Academic Excellence
- e. Chair of Student Rights and Advocacy
- f. Chair of University Improvements
- g. Longest Serving Student Senator

Article III: Judicial Branch

Section 1: Structure

- A. The Judicial Council shall consist of Five Justices with one serving as Chief Justice and the others as Associate Justices

Section 2: Judicial Qualifications and Terms

- A. All Justices shall serve a term that begins upon their taking the oath of office and that ends upon their graduation, departure from Northern Kentucky University, resignation, or removal from office
- B. Shall maintain a 2.5 cumulative GPA and a 2.0 semester GPA throughout their term

Section 3: Appointment of the Chief Justice

- A. The Chief Justice shall be appointed by the President from the current pool of justices and must be confirmed by a majority vote of the Justices and by a majority vote of the Student Senate
- B. Shall serve as Chief Justice for the duration of the academic year that will expire at the conclusion of the Spring Election

Section 4: Judicial Council Powers and Duties

- A. Shall ensure the constitutionality of government actions. Those actions may include: Resolutions, Honorary Resolutions, Executive Orders, or other official government actions. This may take the form of Judicial Council Opinions
- B. Shall review the Constitution and Bylaws on a regular basis and may propose recommendations to the Student Senate for amendments
- C. Associate Justices shall attend meetings of the SGA unless a class conflict occurs
- D. Shall manage all elections of the SGA
 - a. This shall include any election grievances that take place
- E. When questions of the constitution arise, the Judicial Council shall have the power to answer those questions with a Judicial Council Opinions
- F. Shall preside over the impeachment hearings of Non-Judicial Council members

Section 5: Chief Justice Powers and Duties

- A. Shall preside over the Judicial Council
- B. Shall be responsible for overseeing all actions of the Judicial Council including Constitutional Review and Judicial Council Opinions
- C. Shall attend, enforce, and uphold rules and parliamentary procedure during Student Government Meetings
- D. Shall receive a stipend per semester

Section 6: Jurisdiction

- A. The Judicial Council's jurisdiction shall be matters in regard to the SGA and its reach. The Judicial Council shall not act as a body to resolve conflicts involving other Registered Student Organizations or students

Section 7: Judicial Council Opinions

- A. A Judicial Council Opinion is an official document drafted by the Judicial Council that provides interpretation and explanation of the Constitution and sets binding precedent
- B. Judicial Council Opinions shall begin when a question is raised by a member of government in writing to the Judicial Council
- C. The Judicial Council shall decide whether to write a full opinion by majority vote
 - a. Questions of the Constitution may also be answered informally if not deemed to require a full Opinion
 - b. The decision on whether to write an opinion must be given within three official school days
- D. The Judicial Council may override past rulings
- E. If any party is aggrieved with a decision of the Judicial Council they may write an appeal to the Dean of Students within five official school days

Section 8: Constitutional Review Hearings

- A. If a student concludes that an action of the SGA is unconstitutional, they may appeal in writing to the Judicial Council through the Office of the Dean of Students no more than ten official school days following the SGA action
 - a. The Judicial Council must conduct a hearing and render a decision on such an appeal within five official school days after the appeal is submitted unless an extension is necessary or reasonable due to the circumstances of the case
 - b. The Chief Justice shall preside over the hearing with all Associate Justices being present and shall ask questions to both parties as they see fit
 - i. The petitioner, the aggrieved party, shall have an opening argument
 - ii. The respondent, the party under review, shall give a rebuttal and argument
 - iii. The hearing shall conclude with the petitioner's rebuttal
 - iv. The amount of time that both parties have to speak shall be of equal length determined by the Chief Justice
 - c. The decision of the Judicial Council shall come in the form of a Judicial Council Opinion with the content of the hearing serving as the question
 - d. If the Judicial Council decides that the action is unconstitutional, the SGA must revoke the action and nullify any actions or legislation taken pursuant to the revoked action unless an appeal is filed with five official school days with the Office of the Dean of Students
 - e. If the student is aggrieved by the Judicial Council interpretation, they may appeal to the Office of the Dean of Students within five official school days for a final determination

Article IV: Elections

Section 1: Election Eligibility

- A. Any student enrolled at Northern Kentucky University who is in good standing as defined by the University and has a 2.5 cumulative GPA shall be eligible to run for election

Section 2: Election Schedules

A. Election of Executives

- a. The President and Vice President shall be elected in the Spring Election
- b. The President and Vice President shall run as a slate
- c. Candidates for President must fulfill the requirements to serve as a Student Regent

B. Election of the Legislature

- a. The Spring Election may have no more than twenty-five Senators elected
 - i. Senators shall run for the College Representative Seat that their major corresponds to
 - ii. If a student is undecided or has an interdisciplinary major/path they may run for an At-Large Seat
- b. Five Senators shall be elected in the Fall Election who are in their first semester enrolled at Northern Kentucky University after graduating high school or receiving a GED

C. Election Timelines

- a. The spring election shall take place on the first Wednesday and Thursday of April, with election applications being made available during the first week of March
- b. The fall election shall take place during the 4th week of the academic year on the Wednesday and Thursday of that week, with election applications being made available during the first week of the school year

Section 3: Election Rules and Guidelines

A. General Election Rules and Guidelines

- a. Acknowledgment of the Election Rules and Guidelines is due five official school days prior to the beginning of the fall and spring elections
- b. Any other relevant documentation that the Judicial Council deems necessary shall be additionally submitted
- c. Use of university listservs and phone rosters is strictly prohibited
- d. No type of campaign material may be libelous in nature
- e. Any dispute involving election rules and guidelines must be submitted in writing to the Dean of Students
- f. All materials and posting of materials must follow established University policies

B. Fall Elections

- a. The previous spring election rules and guidelines shall be enforced during the following fall election

C. Spring Elections

- a. Spring election rules and guidelines must be drafted and confirmed by the Judicial Council by February 15th. If the rules and guidelines are not drafted and confirmed by this date, the most recently enacted guidelines shall be enforced
- b. The Judicial Council must provide approved election rules and guidelines and election applications by March 1st

Section 4: Managing Elections

A. The Judicial Council shall be responsible for:

- a. Drafting, approving, and distributing election rules and guidelines
- b. Resolving questions or concerns regarding how elections are to be held
- c. Enforcing election rules
- d. Creating election ballots

B. The Chief Justice or their designee and the Dean of Students or their designee shall certify the election and publish all election results

Section 5: Election Regulation and Grievance Procedures

A. The Judicial Council shall have original jurisdiction in cases involving alleged infractions of the election rules and guidelines

B. Any election grievance must be submitted in writing to the Office of the Dean of Students within three official school days following the election

- a. Within three official school days following the date on which the grievance was filed, the Judicial Council must conduct a hearing on said grievance

C. The Chief Justice shall preside over the hearing with all Associate Justices being present and shall ask questions to both parties as they see fit

- a. The petitioner, the aggrieved party, shall have an opening argument
- b. The respondent, the party under review, shall give a rebuttal and argument
- c. The hearing shall conclude with the petitioner's rebuttal
- d. The amount of time that both parties have to speak shall be of equal length determined by the Chief Justice

D. The decision of the Judicial Council shall come in the form of a Judicial Council Opinion

- a. A decision on the matter must be decided within three official school days of the hearing

E. The Judicial Council may declare a candidate disqualified or an election void if there is evidence of violations of standing election rules and guidelines, fraud, corrupt practice in the voting, the miscounting of votes, significant campaign violations, or ineligibility regarding a candidate's qualifications

- a. If a party is aggrieved by a decision of the Judicial Council, that party may further appeal for final determination of the matter to the Office of the Dean of Students within three official school days of the Judicial Council's decision
- F. If an election is voided, the election will be conducted again the following week
 - a. No candidate would be required to resubmit documentation unless a rule or regulation were to be struck down from the voided election by the Judicial Council
 - b. No new candidates shall be added after an election is voided

Article V: Impeachment and Removal

Section 1: Call for Impeachment

- A. Articles of impeachment may be brought before the Senate during a regularly scheduled meeting by any Senator
 - a. The articles of impeachment must contain the grounds of impeachment and then will be subject to discussion prior to a final vote
- B. If a supermajority of the Senate confirms the Articles of Impeachment, then it shall constitute an official impeachment

Section 2: Grounds for Impeachment

- A. Dereliction of duty, accruing three or more unexcused absences in a semester, falling below required GPA, failure to regularly complete office hours, or failing to complete the duties of office
- B. Engaging in conduct that brings discredit to the student body or is unbecoming of a member of the Student Government Association or violations of the Student Code of Conduct.

Section 3: Internal Grievance Meeting

- A. An Internal Grievance Meeting may occur when any member of government determines that another member of government is neglecting their duties.
- B. They may then file a complaint with the President who shall call a meeting with the Chief Justice, Speaker of the Senate, and other relevant parties present
- C. The President shall preside over the meeting where the complaints shall be reviewed and discussed
- D. If it is determined that the member of government is neglecting their duty, a sanction shall be delivered to the party to either improve the performance of duty or otherwise correct conduct
- E. After fifteen official school days, the sanctioned party shall meet with the President to determine if performance is improved or conduct is corrected
 - a. If no progress is determined, the Senate shall be informed

Section 4: Removal Hearing for Non-Judicial Council Members

- A. Following the presentation of Articles for Impeachment of a Non-Judicial Council Member, the Judicial Council will conduct a hearing
- B. The hearing shall take place within five official school days following the filing of the Articles wherein the Chief Justice shall preside over the hearing with all Associate Justices being present and shall ask questions to both parties as they see fit
 - a. The petitioner, the member of government bringing the petition, shall have an opening argument
 - b. The respondent, the member of government under review, shall give a rebuttal and argument

- c. The hearing shall conclude with the petitioner's rebuttal
 - d. The amount of time that both parties have to speak shall be of equal length determined by the Chief Justice
- C. The decision shall come in the form of a Judicial Council Opinion within three official school days with the hearing serving as the question
 - D. If the Judicial Council determines that the respondent is in violation of the grounds of which they are accused, they may call for their removal
 - E. If the respondent is aggrieved by the decision of the Judicial Council, they may appeal in writing to the Office of the Dean of Students for final determination within three official school days

Section 5: Removal Hearing of Judicial Council Members

- A. Following the impeachment of a Judicial Council Member, a hearing will be conducted
- B. The SGA Advisors shall conduct a hearing within five official school days following the filing of the Articles for Impeachment
 - a. The petitioner, the member of government bringing the petition, shall have an opening argument
 - b. The respondent, the member of government under review, shall give a rebuttal and argument
 - c. The hearing shall conclude with the petitioner's rebuttal
 - d. The amount of time that both parties have to speak shall be of equal length determined by the SGA Advisors
- C. The decision shall be given within three official school days to the General Body
- D. If it is determined that the respondent is in violation of the grounds of which they are accused, their removal may be called for
- E. If the respondent is aggrieved by the decision, they may appeal in writing to the Office of the Dean of Students for final determination within three official school days

Section 6: Removal Process

- A. Following the determination of the guilt, that member of government will be removed from their office
- B. Depending on the severity of their offenses, penalties may range from barring return for a set amount of time or as great as barring affiliation with the Student Government Association for the remainder of their tenure as a student of NKU
 - a. The penalty shall come from the group that conducted the original hearing

Article VI: Advisors and University Administration

Section 1: Role of the Advisors

- A. Advisors to the Student Government, along with the Dean of Students, shall act as the official liaison between the Student Government Association and NKU administration
- B. Advisors shall provide counsel to SGA toward its goals and in meeting its objectives

Section 2: Powers and Duties of the Advisors

- A. Shall serve as a resource to SGA regarding university policies, regulations, and parliamentary procedures
- B. Shall oversee the efforts of the Secretary of Administration regarding financial matters and shall review and approve all SGA expenditures
- C. Shall ensure that university regulations, institutional policies, federal, and state laws, and the SGA Constitution and By-Laws are upheld and adhered to by the SGA
- D. Shall review and approve all contracts and external agreements to be entered into by SGA
- E. Shall be their duty to attend SGA meetings unless it interferes with their other University duties
- F. Shall assist the Judicial Council with elections

Section 3: Appointment of Advisors

- A. Advisors shall be appointed by the Chief Student Affairs officer

Section 4: Appealing Actions of the Advisors

- A. Wherein a member of the Student Government feels that an act of an Advisor is in violation of their role, power, or duty they may write an appeal to the Chief Student Affairs officer
 - a. Wherein an Advisor is the Chief Student Affairs officer the appeal will be written to their supervisor
- B. Following the written appeal, the Chief Student Affairs officer shall conduct a hearing where both parties will have an equal opportunity to present their case
- C. The Chief Student Affairs officer may take any intermediary action they see fit to resolve the appeal

Article VII: Bylaws

Section 1: Purpose and Scope

- A. The bylaws of the Student Government Association shall serve as the operational and procedural rules that govern its internal functioning
- B. These bylaws shall act as complementary to the provisions outlined in this Constitution and are designed to provide clarity and structure to the day-to-day operations, ensuring that the organization adheres to its mission, values, and obligations

Section 2: Adherence

- A. No provisions within the bylaws may contradict this constitution

Section 3: Amendment to the Bylaws

- A. Any amendments to the Bylaws must follow the legislative process with an exception
 - a. A Senator must motion to start the amendment process, however, the proposed amendment does not need to go to committee but instead the Senator shall send their amendment to the Secretary of Administration and Speaker of the Senate following their motion
- B. Following the passage of an amendment to the bylaws, the document will be updated to reflect the change

Article VIII: Amendments

Section 1: Proposition

- A. Proposals for Constitutional Amendments will be accepted for consideration and possible ratification from:
 - a. The Student Senate following a majority vote, or
 - b. A student petition signed by three percent of the student body, or
 - c. The Board of Regents

Section 2: Ratification

- A. Ratification of Constitutional Amendments must:
 - a. Be reviewed by the Chief Student Affairs Officer and the President of the University with their recommendations submitted to the Senate,
 - b. Receive a supermajority vote from the Student Senate,
 - c. A majority vote in one of the Special Student Body Elections pertaining only to Constitutional Amendments which shall begin at 8:00 am on the first Wednesday, in which the University is open, of the months of November and March and shall end at 10:00 pm the next day,
 - d. And must be approved by the Board of Regents (KRS 164.350)

Section 3: Documentation

- A. All amendments shall be listed as they are ratified in a separate list following
- B. The first amendment shall be titled "Amendment 1" and all future amendments shall be listed in the order in which they were proposed before ratification
- C. Each amendment, as they are ratified, shall have a subtitle that shall simply be the academic year in which they are ratified

Section 4: Supremacy

- A. All amendments, as they are ratified, shall supersede the sections of the Constitution they reference or conflict with

Article IX: Limitations

Section 1: Nothing in this Constitution shall be construed in such a manner as to be in conflict with laws (federal and state), University policy, or the bylaws and regulations of the Board of Regents of NKU

- A. Any legislation that conflicts with the laws of the nation or state, University regulations or policies, or within this Constitution or its bylaws, and if such proposed legislation is adopted, it is null and void
- B. The NKU Board of Regents may amend or repeal any portion of the Constitution or action of SGA when, in the judgment of the Board, the interests of the university may require it

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board of Regents approve the proposed Intellectual Diversity and Viewpoint Neutrality policy statement.

BACKGROUND:

In March 2025, the Kentucky General Assembly enacted House Bill 4, which primarily addresses diversity, equity, and inclusion initiatives at Kentucky’s public universities. The new law also includes a separate requirement that university governing boards adopt a policy to “promote intellectual diversity within the institution” and to prohibit discrimination based on an individual’s “political or social viewpoint.”

The law requires governing boards to adopt this language by June 30, 2025.

Administration recommends that the Board meet this requirement by adopting the Intellectual Diversity and Viewpoint Neutrality policy statement that appears in the enclosed resolution.

This statement would be included in the University’s Free Expression policy. A revised version of that policy will be presented to Faculty Senate and other campus stakeholders later this year, and any additional changes that emerge from that process will be presented to the Board for final approval.

RESOLUTION

INTELLECTUAL DIVERSITY and VIEWPOINT NEUTRALITY POLICY STATEMENT

WHEREAS, in March 2025, the Kentucky General Assembly enacted House Bill 4, which requires Kentucky public university governing boards to adopt a policy on intellectual diversity and viewpoint neutrality no later than June 30, 2025.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Regents approves the following intellectual diversity and viewpoint neutrality policy statement, to be included within the institution's Free Expression policy:

Northern Kentucky University is committed to offering an excellent education in which scholars engage in a robust exchange of ideas, critique theories and test assumptions, challenge the unexamined, produce creative works, and welcome thoughtful dissent – all in service of our shared search for truth and new knowledge. Our University embraces intellectual diversity and the informed expression and probing of ideas from all perspectives, which are essential to the vitality of our institution and the preparation of our students.

In keeping with this commitment, the University will not discriminate against an individual on the basis of the individual's political or social viewpoint.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Board of Regents approves the Schedule of Tuition and Mandatory Fees and the Schedule of Fees and Service Charges for the 2025-2026 academic year. The Board of Regents approved housing, Food Service, and service charges for the 2025-2026 academic year on February 26, 2025.

BACKGROUND:

Tuition and Mandatory Fees: A complete listing is attached. Proposed tuition rates for most programs are increased by 3.9% with limited exceptions. The President will submit final rates to the Council on Postsecondary Education (CPE) for approval at their next meeting. CPE permitted Undergraduate tuition increases of up to 3.9% for the 2025-2026 academic year.

If tuition increases are not granted, NKU would be forced to absorb rising costs for utilities, health insurance, and software, but further reduce other expenditures, such as personnel.

CPE policy allows the institution to set graduate, law, and doctoral tuition rates. With limited exceptions, the recommendation is a 3.9% increase to all rates for these tuition items.

Course Fees/Program Fees/Service Charges: Course fees include charges to students to participate in the instructional activities of selected courses, including the cost of providing course materials to be consumed, retained, or used by the student; the special fees associated with the use of University-owned tools, musical instruments, or other equipment including charges for breakage; or the cost of different materials or services necessary to provide an exceptional supplemental educational experience of direct benefit to the student. A complete listing of all course fees is attached. Program fees are similar to course fees, but are from an overall program perspective. Service Charges are fees to offset the costs of various services provided to students, faculty, staff, and the broader community (for details, please see the following schedule).

Included in course fees, program fees, and service charges is a new fee for first-time undergraduate students at the University. This one-time, non-mandatory fee of \$450 for all first-time, full-time students and \$225 for all first-time, part-time students will be billed during their first semester. Full-time is defined as 12 or more credit hours, and part-time is defined as 6-11 credit hours. Undergraduate students taking 0-5 credit hours will not be assessed this fee.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Board of Regents, with the unanimous support of the Budget and Finance Committee, approves the proposed Annual Unrestricted Operating Budget for the fiscal year 2025-26. The committee, after a comprehensive review, voted to recommend approval on May 30, 2025.

BACKGROUND:

The University has completed its financial planning and budgeting activities for the upcoming fiscal year, which will begin July 1, 2025, and end June 30, 2026. The resulting Annual Unrestricted Operating Budget is proposed for approval by the Board of Regents.

The proposed budget includes total projected revenues of \$221,492,003 (revenues are presented net of institutional scholarships, discounts, and contractual AOL revenue share) and expenses of \$221,420,592, for a net surplus of \$71,411.

Significant expenditure reductions have been implemented over the last three years to reduce and eliminate reliance on reserves for the operating budget (excluding non-recurring scholarships). These efforts were undertaken at the direction of the Board of Regents. The administration is unwavering in its commitment to closely monitor the financial performance of the fiscal year 2025-26, ensuring the University's adherence to this budget.

BOARD OF REGENTS RESOLUTION

APPROVAL OF FY26 ANNUAL UNRESTRICTED OPERATING BUDGET

WHEREAS, the university administration has proposed an annual unrestricted operating budget for the 2025-26 fiscal year consisting of total projected revenues of \$221,492,003 (revenues are presented net of institutional scholarships, discounts, and contractual AOL revenue share) and expenses of \$221,420,592.

WHEREAS, the Board of Regents Budget & Finance Committee met on May 30, 2025, to review the proposed Annual Operating Budget for the 2025-26 fiscal year; the Budget & Finance Committee voted unanimously to recommend approval of the proposed budget.

WHEREAS, the Board of Regents has the authority and responsibility to approve the institution's annual budget, as mandated by Kentucky law and the Board of Regents' bylaws.

BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Regents approves the proposed FY26 Annual Unrestricted Operating Budget, subject to the requirements described herein.

The President is authorized to approve adjustments between budget authorizations when such action appears, in their judgment, to be in the best interests of the University. However, any adjustment that would increase the approved Annual Unrestricted Operating Budget authorization shall be submitted to this Board for approval at its next meeting.

The President shall be authorized to take appropriate measures to reduce budgeted expenditure authorizations by sufficient amounts to ensure that unrestricted expenditures do not exceed authorized unrestricted sources of funds.

In incurring financial obligations, spending, and disbursing University funds available under this authorization, all University units and personnel, as well as agents, shall adhere to and observe the applicable laws, regulations, and policies of both the Commonwealth of Kentucky and the University, which govern and control the expenditure of funds.

Administrators of the various units shall not authorize or incur any financial obligations beyond the budgeted amounts.
