- Statements should be shortened for clarity and conciseness.
- Key words and concepts from the forum and survey responses emphasized excellence and high standards.
- Student success is a primary focus.
- Public engagement is a distinguishing attribute.
- Preparing students for careers and graduate studies is of high importance.
- Integrity is an important value not currently noted.
