being state-assisted, not state-funded; 3) the importance of improving overall efficiencies; 4) improbability of state funds for new programs; and 5) performance funding.		
Institutional Trends has three subgroups focusing on: 1) social adjustment; 2) retention and persistence data; and 3) college readiness & undeclared students.		
Demographics/Labor Market Forces has their first draft composed, but it's too long, so they are revising and putting backup data in attachments. They are reviewing the characteristics of this generation of students and how that affects dropout rates.		
Technology group has pulled in the IT student report. The group is talking about focusing on key concepts and making information immediate, transparent, and flexible.		
Public Engagement is well on its way with a rough draft being produced.		
The open forums were discussed. It was mentioned that it is important for an institution to develop distinction and that our future depends on it. We need to focus on our strengths. We must focus on what we have as core competencies and decide where we are going to focus our resources. SPC may be recommending processes and timelines for implementation. Change management training may be needed.
