Students have the opportunity to participate on a large variety of program over spring, summer and winter breaks. These programs range from 1 week up to 6 weeks in length. Students may choose from multiple programs including: NKU Faculty-led Short Term programs; the Cooperative Center for Study Abroad (CCSA) which offers approximately 10 programs a year over winter and summer breaks to English speaking regions of the world; and the Kentucky Institute for International Studies (KIIS), which offers 25 programs over the summer break to non-English speaking regions of the world.
