



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
Undergraduate Degrees Conferred FY 2006-07 to FY 2011-12



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Graduate Degress Conferred FY 2006-07 to FY 2011-12



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

Certificates Earned FY 2006-07 to FY 2011-12



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




Undergraduate Enrollment by Full, Part-Time Status and Gender Fall 2006 to Fall 2011





Total Enrollment Age Distribution Proportion Fall 2006 to Fall 2011




Age Distributions - By Program Level Fall 2006 to Fall 2011




Undergraduate Degree-Seeking Age Distribution Proportion Fall 2006 to Fall 2011




Undergraduate Non-Degree Age Distribution Proportion Fall 2006 to Fall 2011




Graduate Degree-Seeking Age Distribution Proportion Fall 2006 to Fall 2011




Graduate Non-Degree Age Distribution Proportion Fall 2006 to Fall 2011




Law Age Distribution Proportion Fall 2006 to Fall 2011

CH 30 = **Montgomery GI Bill Active Duty:** To be eligible for the Montgomery GI Bill students must have served as a member of the armed forces on active duty on or after July 1, 1985. They must have a high school diploma or a GED and have participated in the program, having had \$100 withheld each month for 12 months.

CH 31 = **Vocational Rehabilitation** - **Disabled Veterans:** A disabled veteran who has a service-connected disability of 20 percent or more may qualify. If eligible, veterans receive full tuition, fees and book coverage. Disabled veterans must complete the appropriate paperwork and receive counseling through the Veterans Administration.

CH 35 = Survivors' and Dependents' Educational Assistance Program: This covers a son, daughter or spouse of a veteran who has a 100 percent permanent and total service-connected disability or the son/daughter or spouse of a veteran whose death was service-connected.

CH 33 = Post -9/11 GI Bill: The Post-9/11 GI Bill provides financial support for education and housing to individuals with at least 90 days of aggregate service after September 10, 2001, or individuals discharged with a service-connected disability after 30 days. You must have received an honorable discharge to be eligible for the Post-9/11 GI Bill.

CH 1606 = Montgomery GI Bill: Selected Reserve Reservists who enlist or reenlist for a period of six years after June 30, 1985 and who have a high school diploma or GED are eligible upon completion of 180 days of Reserve service.

CH 1607 = Reserve Education Assistance Program: Reservists who have been activated for 90 consecutive days or more since September 11, 2001. Must remain in the Reserves to maintain eligibility.





Undergraduate Credit Hour Production Proportion Fall 2006 to Fall 2011




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Undergraduate Credit Hour Production Fall 2006 to Fall 2011





Average Undergraduate Class Size, Fall Semester


