#### Meet the Horticulture Team!

As Fall is quickly changing to Winter, our NKU landscape is in the midst of change to get ready for the months ahead. The horticulture team is working diligently each day to remove our Spring and Summer plants across campus making way for the winter landscape. The team takes pride in their criteria for selection of new plants for each season. Not only does seasonal color and growth potential play a role in the selection process, but the sustainability of a plant species may be the most important factor.

Some of the sustainability attribute criteria include tolerance to drought, tolerance to pests, tolerance to climate year around and a plants' regrowth potential.

Many of our plants, both in the ground and in planters, are currently being painstakingly transported to their winter home at the NKU Horticulture greenhouse and storage sheds where they will be cared for until the Spring planting season returns. Some of these plants are already several years old and poised to deliver landscape pleasure for years to come. The horticulture team is passionate about the work and service they provide maintaining an eco-balanced and beautiful landscape for the enjoyment of our NKU community.

'The diversity of plant life exists for many reasons, one being adaptive change. When a plant is used in a landscape, it provides a variety of ecological services, including shade, wildlife habitat, clean water, healthy soil and clean air. If we only use a small variety of plants and those plant types become sick or are attacked by a pest, the landscape will take a long time to recover.'

#### Natural Pest Control **Praying Mantis**

During the Spring and Summer months, NKU's campus is teeming with praying mantis. While they are plentiful, our horticulture staff are the rare few that actually see them on a regular basis because of their close proximity in and around our plants and trees. Praying mantis are often considered a beneficial insect because they eat many plant harming insects. They help serve as a natural form of pest control.

As the Fall season begins, our crew consider it a bonus when a praying mantis egg sac is found, typically on a tree branch or twig. Egg sacs generally hatch in the Spring producing hundreds of infants from a single sac. The horticulture staff saves every sac they come across for the green house where the sacs will hatch early due to the mild climate within.

Once hatched, the infants immediately start to feed on the pests that tend to grow and effect the growth of the saved plants within the greenhouse thus helping to preserve these resources for the next beautiful Spring planting season.

Phase 2: <u>Convert PDFs to Webpage Content</u> (where appropriate)

Phase 3: Ensure the Accessibility of all PDFs

Procurement Services is offering trainings on a one-on-one basis or for departments!


