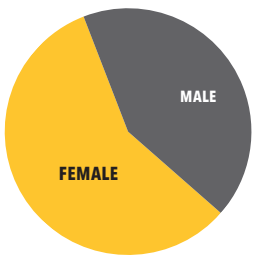
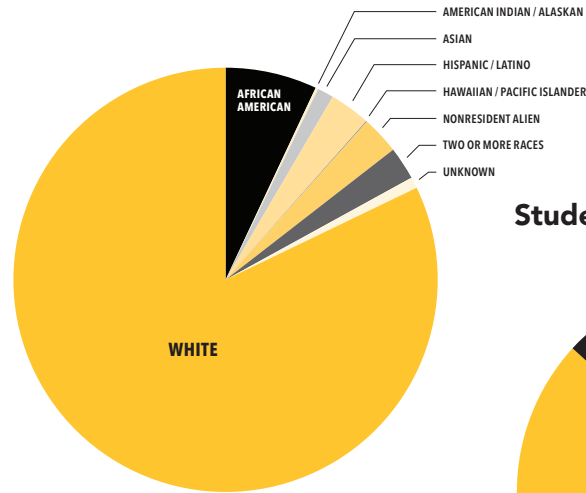

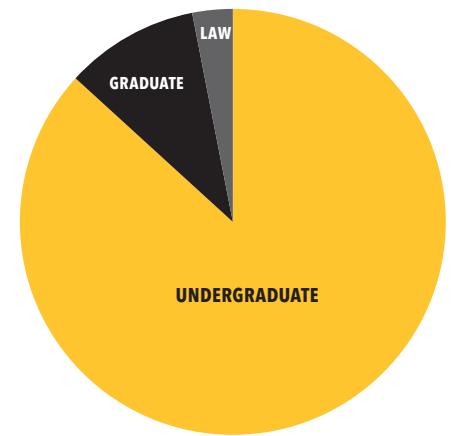

Student Headcount by Level

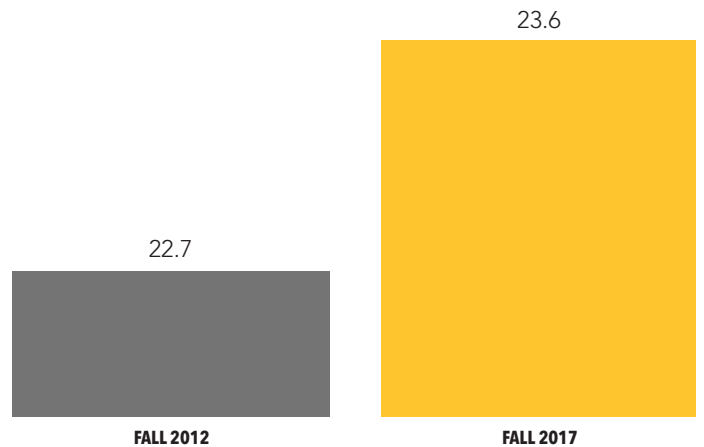
