<ul> <li>Alert people in the area</li> <li>Activate the nearest fire alarm</li> <li>Close doors behind you</li> <li>Leave the building</li> <li>Call UNIVERSITY POLICE (911)</li> <li>Assemble in area designated by your department</li> <li>Do not use elevators to exit building</li> <li>Do not ignore fire alarms</li> <li>Do not use fire extinguisher unless trained</li> <li>Do not fight fires that are larger than a small waste basket</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Call the Health &amp; Counseling Services at X-5650 during regular business hours 8:15 a.m 4:30 p.m. or after hours contact UNIVERSITY POLICE (911) (who will then contact the Director of Health &amp; Counseling.)</li> <li>Do not ignore the situation.</li> <li>Do not feel responsible for handling alone</li> <li>Note: There are psychological consequences to each and every emergency. The Health &amp; Counseling staff is available (X-5650) to assist in these situations.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Check the scene to make sure it is safe for you and the victim (s).</li> <li>Do not move the victim unless the scene is life threatening (ie. fire, imminent explosion).</li> <li>Do not provide first aid without first asking permission of victim.</li> <li>Check the victim for any life threatening emergencies, such as:         <ul> <li>Not fully conscious</li> <li>Breathing problems</li> <li>Heart or chest pain</li> <li>Severe bleeding</li> <li>Poisoning (alcohol/drug emergencies are included)</li> </ul> </li> <li>CALL UNIVERSITY POLICE (911). Give your name &amp; phone #, describe the nature and severity of the medical problem, the campus location of the victim.</li> <li>Stay with the victim and continue to assist and monitor the victim until help arrives</li> <li>Follow the directions of the Campus Nurse, UNIVERSITY POLICE officer or EMT when they arrive</li> <li>NOTE: If victim is unconscious, consent is implied. If a conscious victim refuses care but your judgment tells you they need help – call Public Safety immediately (911) and wait for them to handle the situation.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Remain calm</li> <li>Accept the threat as real</li> <li>Get as much information from the caller as possible</li> <li>Record all information given</li> <li>Evacuate area immediately</li> <li>Contact UNIVERSITY POLICE at (911)</li> <li>Follow instructions from UNIVERSITY POLICE</li> <li>Give description of suspicious persons or packages to UNIVERSITY POLICE</li> <li>Do not touch any suspicious package</li> <li>Do not use radios or cell phones</li> <li>Do not leave campus without contacting UNIVERSITY POLICE</li> <li>Do not re-enter building until cleared by UNIVERSITY POLICE</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Be aware of threatening weather</li> <li>Seek shelter inside</li> <li>Do not go outside</li> <li>Pay attention to local weather and campus emergency announcements</li> </ul> Dorm shelter areas: <i>Kentucky Hall, Commonwealth Hall, University Suites, Callahan Hall -</i> Move to the lowest interior corridor. <i>Norse Hall, Woodcrest Apartments, Northern Terrace -</i> Stay inside your apartment. Shelter in the bathroom. Cover yourself with a mattress or blankets. (Bathrooms make the best shelter areas because the pipes are secured to the ground.) <b>GENERAL RULES -</b> <ul> <li>Do not go into large open areas</li> <li>Do not go near windows or outside doors</li> <li>Sit and cover your head</li> <li>Assist others after the storm has passed</li> </ul> <b>IF OUTSIDE –</b> <ul> <li>Seek cover</li> <li>Lie flat in a depression if no cover available</li> <li>Do not enter storm drains or pipes</li> <li>Leave a vehicle</li> <li>Do not attempt to outrun the storm</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>Contact UNIVERSITY POLICE (911) if a demonstration interferes with operations, prevents access to facilities, or presents a threat of physical harm.</li> <li>Conduct normal business during peaceful demonstrations</li> <li>Keep clear of demonstrations and avoid contact with demonstrators</li> <li>Contact UNIVERSITY POLICE if you witness a violent act</li> <li>Do not attempt to remove demonstrators</li> <li>Do not interfere with UNIVERSITY POLICE</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>INSIDE <ul> <li>Watch for falling objects</li> <li>Crawl under a table, counter, etc.</li> <li>Get into a protective position by sitting on the floor and covering your head with your arms.</li> <li>Stay away from windows, glass partitions and mirrors</li> <li>Stay away from overhead fixtures</li> <li>Stay away from cabinets, electrical appliances, hanging objects</li> </ul> </li> <li>OUTSIDE <ul> <li>Move to an open area away from building structures</li> <li>Watch for fallen streetlights, trees, and flying glass</li> </ul> </li> <li>AFTER THE INCIDENT <ul> <li>Remain calm</li> <li>Be prepared for after-shock</li> <li>If evacuation is order, use the nearest and safest exit</li> <li>DO NOT USE ELEVATORS</li> <li>Do not move seriously injured persons unless they are in danger. Contact UNIVERSITY POLICE (911)</li> <li>Open doors carefully</li> <li>Watch for falling objects</li> <li>Do not use matches/lighters or other sources of ignition</li> <li>Avoid using telephones as emergency response personnel will need these</li> <li>Contact a Residential official to report your condition</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<ul> <li>All persons must evacuate a building when the alarm sounds</li> <li>Residents should be familiar with the designated evacuation location for their dorm</li> <li>Immediately report anyone that may be trapped in a building</li> <li>Do not take personal items</li> <li>Close doors behind you</li> <li>Do not go to restrooms</li> <li>Do not return to your room for personal belongings</li> <li>If smoke is present, stay low</li> <li>Use stairway or horizontal exit to evacuate</li> <li>DO NOT USE ELEVATORS!</li> <li>Do not return to the building until cleared by Public Safety</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Evacuate area if there is a hazardous condition</li> <li>Contact Operations &amp; Maintenance at x5660 during normal business hours or UNIVERSITY POLICE (911) afterwards</li> <li>Do not ignore utility problems</li> <li>Do not assume someone else has called in a problem</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>In the unlikely event of a chemical or biological release you may be asked to seek shelter in your dorm.</li> <li>Turn off heating or air conditioning in your dorm</li> <li>Do not use elevators</li> <li><i>Kentucky, Commonwealth, Callahan</i> and <i>University Suites</i> residents should seek shelter in the hallway on floors above ground level. <i>Woodcrest, Norse Hall,</i> and <i>Northern Terrace</i> residents should seek shelter in the bathroom of the apartment.</li> <li>Use tape, plastic, clothes, etc. to seal off doorways and windows as best as possible</li> <li>Wait for further instruction from Public Safety or other emergency personnel</li> <li>Use phones only to report an emergency</li> <li>Listen to news for further information. <i>It is suggested that students keep a small battery powered radio in their apartment for emergencies</i></li> <li>Once the emergency is over you will be instructed on what to do by University and emergency personnel</li> </ul>
