SEEK AN ADVOCATE

A sexual assault medical exam ensures:

- physical injuries that may have occurred are promptly identified and addressed.
- survivors receive medication for prevention of pregnancy, HIV or other infections.
- evidence is collected by a trained Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner and preserved for a criminal investigation – now or in the future.

ACCESS NKU COUNSELING RESOURCES

Health, Counseling and Student Wellness offers counseling services for students as well as Forward Together, an 8-week sexual assault support group. These services assist students in developing skills to manage negative symptoms resulting from a traumatic experience.

MAKE A COMPLAINT OR CONSULT ABOUT NKU POLICIES/PROCEDURES

MAKE A CRIMINAL COMPLAINT OR ASK FOR POLICE ASSISTANCE

Individuals may choose to take action under criminal statutes and/or university policies. The criminal and university conduct processes are separate but can be pursued concurrently. NKU Police can work with you to file criminal charges or talk to you about the criminal process. They may also be able to assist you in obtaining a protection order.
