How do I file criminal charges?

For misdemeanor offenses:

In the Commonwealth of Kentucky, prosecution for misdemeanors in which an arrest was not or could not be made is accomplished by contacting your local county attorney and filing a written complaint. This complaint will contain a brief statement of facts and set forth the crimes that the defendant is alleged to have committed. Such facts might include a list of witnesses or detailed information about property involved. Complaints can allege multiple crimes arising from the set of facts outlined in the complaint. Defendants will received a copy of the complaint and a court appearance scheduled.

To make a written complaint with the Campbell County Attorney's Office, you will need to bring a copy of your driver's license, a police report, and pertinent information about the person against whom you wish to file a criminal action against, including name, address, date of birth, social security number, and/or driver's license number, if known.

Note: Victims of misdemeanor crimes have up to one year from the date of the crime to file charges. For felony offenses:

Felony offenses are rarer and often charged at the time of the offense. Please contact University Police Criminal Investigations (859-572-6060) if you have questions regarding felony prosecution.
