- Arabic, Chinese, Italian, Korean, and Russia are offered as follows: 101 in the fall semester, 102 in the spring semester. Completing the intermediate level requirements for these courses may involve taking courses off-campus through the regional consortium. Contact the Department of World Languages and Literatures for details regarding regularity and availability of these courses.
- * Students placing out of the 202 level of a language must complete one 300+ level language at NKU.

Secondary Requirements (6 hours): Complete <u>any</u> six hours. Options allow for focus in on region or topic, but <u>any six hours will complete the elective requirement</u>.
