**Foundation of Knowledge:** STA 205 is recommended for meeting general education mathematics requirement; PSC majors yet to meet their writing requirement should take PSC 291W Writing in Political Science for that requirement.

**Grades:** Only courses with a grade of C-- or better may count towards a PSC major, minor or area of concentration.

**Substitution:** A student may substitute a maximum of six hours of readings courses (PSC 499) for secondary requirement courses with the approval of the Department Chair.

Catalog:

**Internship:** An internship course may not count as the only course in an area. Note that Internship credit may vary (3-15 hours) and may include study in Frankfort, KY, Washington, D.C. or study abroad.

**Double Dipping:** Courses meeting these degree requirements may also be used to satisfy Foundation of Knowledge requirements (e.g. up to two (2) from PSC 100, 101, 102, 103, and 110). However, the same upper division course cannot count in more than one secondary requirement area. Also, the Department will accept up to two upper division PSC or PAD courses to meet an area of concentration when the accompanying major is within the department.
