Minor in Pre-Law

Fall 2008 - Spring 2012

The minor in Pre-Law provides a coherent grouping of courses in the foundations and applications of the law. Specifically, the program is designed to acquaint students with:

- 1. different approaches to the study of law, including philosophical, sociological, political, and historical;
- 2. the elements of legal reasoning;
- 3. a body of case law in substantive areas;
- 4. and the skills necessary to succeed in a law school program including logic, research, writing, reading, and analytical thought.

The Pre-Law Minor provides students who major in non-law-related fields and who apply to law school some exposure to legal courses before pursuing their professional education. The minor in Pre-Law does not guarantee successful admission into law school, nor is it a prerequisite for law school. The minor requires completion of two core courses along with at least 24 hours of credits from a list of elective courses.
