1.0 PURPOSE

The purpose of this regulation is to establish parameters for tail and toe clipping of rodents.

2.0 GENERAL INFORMATION AND SCOPE

This regulation applies to all researchers who conduct tail and/or toe clipping of mice and/or rats. This regulation does not apply to "nicking" the tail vein for blood collection.

According to the *Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals*, toe clipping as a method of identification should be used only when no other individual identification method is feasible and should be performed only on altricial neonates. Adequate scientific justification for this procedure must be provided in the protocol and approved by the IACUC. This method is only acceptable when the research is being performed on animals less than 7 days old, and the animals cannot be identified in any other manner.

3.0 DETAILS

For genotyping purposes or identification, mice and rats are often tail clipped or toe clipped. When either of these methods is necessary, the procedure must be described in the approved protocol and the guidelines in thi0n 0.5 cm of the tail is removed and/or when the procedure must be repeated.
