- Invoices

FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT (FERPA)


The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) is a Federal law that protects the privacy of student education records.

- FERPA gives parents certain rights with respect to their children's education records. These rights transfer to the student when they reach the age of 18 or attend a school beyond the high school level.
- The student at their discretion can grant NKU permission to release information to a third party by submitting a completed FERPA Waiver and Student Information Release Authorization form.

FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT (FERPA)

- The FERPA release form is available on the University Registrar's website under Student Resources.
- A student has the ability to select specific third party designees to have access to their student records and the types of information to be provided.
- The types of protected information they may choose to release are:
 - A. Academic information (grades and class schedule)
 - B. Student account/cashier information (bill amount due)
 - C. Financial aid information (scholarship and loan amounts)
 - Without the FERPA waiver on file we cannot discuss account information regardless of who is paying the bill.

USING YOUR MYNKU PORTAL

Students can access MyNKU to:

- View and Accept Financial Aid (Financial Aid)
- View and Pay Bill (Tuition Payment & Statement)
- Sign up for the NKU Installment Plan (Tuition Payment & Statement)
- Enroll in Direct Deposit for Refunds (Bank Accounts)
- Download the annual tax form, 1098-T
- Create a unique login for authorized payers, like parents, to pay their bill. (Register Authorized Payers)



VIEW STUDENT BILL ONLINE

- Available 24/7 on MyNKU (Student Billing)
- Invoices will be available on July 17, 2024. First payment is due by the first day of the semester, August 19, 2024.
 - Includes tuition, housing, and other fees, may be influenced by add/drop schedule changes.
 - Please note that Spring semester invoices are available in early December but we cannot process spring payments until January 1st for tax reporting purposes.
- Official invoices are emailed to your NKU email address, but no need to wait for that email.





FALL '24 TUITION DUE DATE

- DUE August 19, 2024
- Students have three options for tuition payment:
 - Pay full semester balance by August 19, 2024.
 - Have sufficient estimated financial aid approved on the student account statement to cover the full balance.
 - Sign up for the NKU Installment Plan



BILL PAYMENT OPTIONS

- Online Payment Options available through MyNKU
 - E-Check Free option with no additional fees
 - VISA, MasterCard, American Express & Discover service fee of 2.5%
- By Mail Check or Money Order
 - Student Account Services
 - 5320 Campus Drive, AC235
 - Highland Heights, KY 41099
- In Person Cash, Check, or Money Order (Credit cards not accepted)
 - Night Drop Box available in the tunnel between LAC and the UC
- There is a cash limit in place that we can take no more than \$2500 in cash each semester
- *Please include the student name/ID number with all mailed payments!



FALL '24 INSTALLMENT PLAN

NKU's 4 Payment Installment Plan

- The NKU Installment Plan splits the balance into 4 payments, 25% will be due on each date
- The Installment Plan enrollment fee is \$90 and is due with your first installment
- Students who fail to make the required monthly payment by the due date will be subject to an account maintenance fee of 1.5% of the total account balance after each missed payment





FALL '24 INSTALLMENT PLAN DATES

- Fall 2024 Installment Plan Dates
 - August 19, 2024 25% of your tuition and fees + plus the \$90 enrollment fee is due
 - September 19, 2024 25% of your tuition and fee payments due
 - October 18, 2024 25% of your tuition and fee payments due
 - November 18, 2024 Final 25% of your tuition and fee payments due



BALANCE REFUNDS

Refunding occurs 7 days after credit (not estimate) appears on student account

Excess financial aid refunding begins:

- Tuesday September 3, 2024 via Direct Deposit
 - Please allow 24-72 hours for funds to appear in your checking account
- Excess aid/credits added to the account after September 3rd will be processed as a refund 7 days after the credit appears
- Paper refunds sent by mail once a week



DIRECT DEPOSIT

- How to sign up to have your refund sent directly to your checking account via Direct Deposit
- Log into MyNKU Select Student Billing → Under Bank Accounts Click Direct Deposit → Click Add Account → Enter Bank Account Details → Check Box for Account to Refund → Click Review → Click Confirm
- What you'll need:
- Your institution's bank number (also known as "routing number")
- Your bank account number



BOOK ADVANCE AUGUST 12, 2024

Book Advance is a one-time opportunity that allows students to receive a portion of their projected financial aid refund each Fall and Spring semester prior to start of classes and before financial aid is disbursed.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Financial Aid processing is complete with estimated aid amounts viewable on student account (show credit balance).
- MUST BE Signed up for Direct Deposit
- NO financial holds from any department

Book Advance is charged on your account and is deducted from financial aid refund

\$750 maximum – amount will vary based on student's available funds



FINANCIAL HOLDS

- Financial Warning emails are sent to students who have not paid in full or are not on the installment plan after original due date of August 19, 2024
 - Classes are dropped for non-payment on August 22, 2024
- Account balance > \$499
 - Can't register for additional/future classes
 - Can't receive diploma
- Account balance < \$500
 - Can't receive diploma



DROPPING/ADDING CLASSES

- Adding/Dropping classes can affect your tuition and fees and result in you owing a balance (especially after aid has been disbursed).
 - According to Federal Financial Aid Regulations, failure to complete, or withdrawing from courses can result in repayment of financial aid
 - Refer to the Academic Calendar for all important add/drop dates

TUITION REFUND DEADLINES

Session	Start Date	100% Drop Deadline	50% Drop Deadline
Full	August 19th	August 26th	September 10th
Ist Seven Week	August 19th	August 22nd	August 26th
2 nd Seven Week	October 16th	October 19th	October 23rd

WITHDRAWAL INFORMATION

- Completely withdrawing from the university can result in a student owing a bill to the university for financial aid being returned that semester.
- If the student feels it is necessary to withdraw from class,
 please have them speak with their academic advisor and
 the Office of Student Financial Assistance to understand the
 consequences of doing so.



EXTERNAL SCHOLARSHIPS

- Students should send scholarship checks to Student Account Services or bring them into the office for processing.
- Scholarship checks should be made payable to Northern Kentucky University and not to the student.
- Scholarships over \$500 are split between Fall and Spring semesters unless sponsor specifies a different disbursement.



THIRD PARTY BILLING

We can bill a third party for tuition directly. This is often an employer, government program or community sponsor. The third party provider needs to provide an official authorization with the following:

- Must be on agency letterhead
- Must have an official signature
- Must include the billing address of the sponsor
- Contain the name and phone number of a contact person
- Specify the length of the sponsorship
- Specify what fees or portion of fees the sponsor will pay

529 COLLEGE SAVINGS PLANS

- Please contact your provider for payment information and documents required.
- Be sure you submit the payment request at least 2 weeks before tuition due date to avoid payment delays.
- Some plans do provide an authorization that requires an invoice directly from the school. Just send those authorizations to us via email, studentaccountservices@nku.edu.



FULL-TIME FLAT RATE: 15 TO FINISH

Full-Time Flat Rate

- Taking 16 credits each semester is the same tuition cost as taking 12 credits. That is 4 credits for free!
- Avoid the cost of extra semesters.
- Maximize KEES money: KEES money only lasts 8 semesters or within five years of high school graduation.



CONSEQUENCES OF NON-PAYMENT

- If still unpaid after the semester is over with, the account could be sent to a professional collection agency.
 - The collection costs are passed on to the student, which adds up to 33% more to the bill
 - Credit Score decreases
 - Harder to get loans

REMINDERS

- Student's need to check and read their NKU email account daily as all official communication will be sent here.
- Attend, complete, and pass classes to avoid unexpected financial aid repayment.
- File the FAFSA form as early as allowable.
- Know important deadlines and check academic calendars.
- FERPA release on file for discussing account questions and balance owed on student account.
