

A RESOLUTION OF THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION OF NORTHERN KENTUCKY UNIVERSITY, HIGHLAND HEIGHTS, KENTUCKY, REQUESTING THAT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY KEEP THE HEALTH INNOVATIONS CENTER IN THE 2014-2016 CAPITAL BUDGET.

WHEREAS: According to a state-wide survey by the Council on Postsecondary Education, NKU and Western Kentucky University are the only universities with a current education and general space deficit, and

WHEREAS: NKU will need another 450,000 square feet to relieve the space deficit, and

WHEREAS: The addition of the Health Innovations Center to NKU will cover 17 percent of that need, and


WHEREAS: The interactive Health Innovations Center, focused on transdisciplinary education and applied research, is a foundation for impacting the great need for health and wellness professionals in the Commonwealth, and

WHEREAS: A similar plea was issued in NKU's Student Government Association resolution 2011-2012.019, which requested the General Assembly "fund the capital priority project constructing the Health Innovations Center."

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, ON THIS TWENTY-FOURTH DAY OF FEBRUARY 2014, THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION OF NORTHERN KENTUCKY UNIVERSITY, HIGHLAND HEIGHTS, KENTUCKY, REQUESTS THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY KEEP THE HEALTH INNOVATIONS CENTER IN THE BUDGET.
