A RESOLUTION OF THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION OF NORTHERN KENTUCKY UNIVERSITY, HIGHLAND HEIGHTS, KENTUCKY, REQUESTING THAT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FUND KENTUCKY PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS THROUGH AN OUTCOMES-BASED FORMULA.

- WHEREAS: In 1985, the state funded 68 percent of the cost of Northern Kentucky University (NKU) students' education and the students funded only 32 percent, and
- WHEREAS: Today, NKU students are responsible for funding 75 percent of their education, and the state has decreased its funding to only 25 percent, and
- WHEREAS: NKU would need another \$16 million annually to equal the same funding per student that the other regional, comprehensive Kentucky public institutions receive, and
- WHEREAS: The General Assembly has continued to appropriate the lowest state share in public funds to NKU as compared to Kentucky's other public universities, and
- WHEREAS: Senate Bill 2 from the 2013 General Assembly session increased NKU's employer contribution to the Kentucky Educational Retirement System (KERS) by nearly \$5 million, and
- WHEREAS: This is the equivalent of a 5 percent tuition increase for NKU students (over \$200 per student) with no additional educational return on investment (ROI), and
- WHEREAS: According to a Northern Kentucky University press release,
 AffordableCollegesOnline.org recognized Northern Kentucky University, "as having
 the greatest lifetime return on investment among Kentucky's colleges and
 universities," with a ROI of \$583,000, and
- WHEREAS: If the state funded Kentucky public institutions through an outcomes-based formula, NKU would be able to further improve the ROI and other benefits of attending the University, and
- WHEREAS: When students receive a quality education through a properly funded state university, graduate, and become employed, the benefits impact the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, ON THIS TWENTY-FOURTH DAY OF FEBRUARY 2014, THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION OF NORTHERN KENTUCKY UNIVERSITY, HIGHLAND HEIGHTS, KENTUCKY, REQUESTS THAT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FUND KENTUCKY PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS THROUGH AN OUTCOMES-BASED FORMULA.
