Student Highlight - Meagan Smith

This month, the Care Closet @NKU would like to highlight a very special student in honor of Women's History Month. Our student highlight is 32-year-old elementary education major & amazing mom of three, Meagan Smith. Megan graduates this May with honors.

Meagan is originally from Southern California but was part of a military family that lived all over the country. Eventually, she ended up in Cincinnati where she met her husband. She then settled down in Bethel, Ohio where they live with their three children.



When asked about herself, Meagan said, "Sometimes I feel I am nothing more than a mother and a student, then I remember how much I love being outdoors, reading books, and drinking coffee. I graduated high school in California in 2010 with B's and C's, then went back to college in 2021, and that was a huge adjustment, especially because my youngest is about to be 3 years old and I graduate in May. However, I am graduating with a 3.9 GPA. Something I never anticipated! I have built so much confidence and belief in myself since being at NKU."

Meagan first learned about the Care Closet @ NKU through University Connect and Persist (UCAP). She said she was hesitant at first but with the encouragement of Caitlin Drouillard-Ahlrichs, Program Coordinator & her LIFT scholarship advisor, she decided to go. She says, "They provided not just clothing but also kindness and support. After having my third child, I struggled to afford professional clothes, but thanks to the Care Closet, I now have outfits that make me feel confident and ready for success."

Meagan gives credit to the Care Closet @ NKU for showing her the care that NKU has for its students. She said "no matter your background, where you come from, who you are, they support you. Thanks to the Care Closet, I can confidently attend interviews and clinicals, knowing I look professional. The level of support here is inspiring and life changing." She also states the important role that resources such as the Care Closet @ NKU and FUEL NKU play on campus saying "These resources are invaluable. As women, we tend to take on everything and help everyone before we help ourselves! With the help of the Care Closet, FUEL, UCAP, PAC, ATC, and so much more, some of our burdens are lifted. I have gotten lunch for myself at times and for my children when needed while at NKU for long days, I have gotten grants to help with childcare, and clothes to help with my career success. As a woman, it is so hard to have the weight of school, jobs, children, finances, and more on our shoulders. With programs like these at NKU, it relieves that stress and builds not only support but a foundation of trust and love so that we can be successful."

Meagan has truly shown what women can do at NKU. She has succeeded in so many ways and has shown that when using the resources around you, you can truly thrive.

As Meagan gets ready to graduate this spring, she leaves the women of NKU with these words, "...take the leap. Always keep pushing forward because there were so

many times I thought about putting my academic career on hold because of life with kids and money. NKU advisors and programs like UCAP helped me to break down my goals, help me reach those goals, and build on my success. I have had so much support throughout my four years here and you can too. You must reach out for help - as hard as I know that can be for some (me too), you just have to. The support NKU gives to us as women is incredible, but you must be able to take that first step and continue to believe in yourself. We are strong! One day at a time, reach out to professors, programs, advisors, and they will get you there. ... I want women to know that it's possible. You might doubt yourself, but I promise—you can do this. There will be ups and downs, but take it one day at a time, breathe, and trust yourself. You are not alone. NKU has built a community of support—jump in, take chances, and believe in yourself. You got this!"
