## NKU Provost Award for Excellence in Student Learning Outcomes Assessment

The NKU Provost award for excellence in learning outcomes assessment is awarded to the NKU degree program that demonstrates excellence in its student learning outcomes assessment processes. Excellence is defined as having developed clear learning outcomes statements, the use of appropriate assessment measures, engagement in an in-depth analysis of the assessment results, and effective use of the assessment results to improve the program. The recipient of this award receives \$3000.00 to support assessment and students' success related initiatives for their program. 2021-2022 Award Recipient - The World Language & Literatures BA program is the recipient of the 2021-2022 NKU Provost Award for Excellence in Student Learning Outcomes Assessment. This program demonstrated a strong culture of assessment and an infrastructure to support the assessment initiatives for continuous improvement with the establishment of an assessment review committee that annually reviews its assessment initiatives. The program has also demonstrated clear examples of how the assessment results are being used to improve student learning.

The World Language & Literatures program will share its assessment practices during a presentation held on **September 27**<sup>th</sup> at 1:00 pm – 2:30 pm in SU 108. The Chemistry program, which was the recipient of the 2020-2021 award, will also share how they used the award to enhance their assessment processes.
