Gary Walton has published seven books of poetry. His latest, *Anonymous America*, will be forthcoming from Finishing Line Press in 2026. He has been nominated for the Pushcart prize twice and in 2010, he was voted Third Place: "Best Local Author" Best of Cincinnati 2010 issue in *City Beat* magazine.

James O'Bannon is a writer, born and raised in Cincinnati, Ohio. He is a Tin House Workshop Alumna, and a finalist for the Ghost Peach Poetry Prize. His work has appeared in *Waxwing Literary Journal*, Nomadic Press as part of the Nomadic Ground Series, *Triquarterly*, *Northwest Review*, among other journals.

Kelly Ritter (formerly Moffett) is a two-time Fulbright Scholar with three poetry books, two chapbooks, and poems in journals such as *Colorado Review*, *Rattle*, *Cortland Review*, *Cincinnati Review*, *Copper Nickel*, and *The Laurel Review*. She has won three teaching awards and has been a recipient of six grants from the Kentucky Foundation for Women.
